Anthony F. Earley Jr. is Chairman, Chief Executive Officer, and President of PG&E Corporation. Earley joined PG&E in September 2011 after 17 years at Detroit-based DTE Energy, where he served as chairman and chief executive officer for 12 years, before becoming executive chairman of the board in September 2010.

As former chairman of the Edison Electric Institute, the trade association of investorowned utilities, Earley was directly involved in the development of national policies on energy, the environment, and climate change issues. Earley also served as chair of the Nuclear Energy Institute and worked to revitalize the nuclear industry in the United States.

Earley earned a Bachelor of Science degree in physics, a Master of Science degree in engineering, and a law degree at the University of Notre Dame, where he serves on the advisory council of the College of Engineering. After graduating from Notre Dame, Earley went on to serve as an officer in the United States Navy nuclear submarine program, where he was qualified as a chief engineer officer. He joined DTE Energy as president and chief operating officer in March 1994. Prior to joining DTE Energy, Earley served in various capacities of increasing responsibility at Long Island Lighting Co., including president and chief operating officer and executive vice president and general counsel.

Earley serves on the executive committees of the Edison Electric Institute and the Nuclear Energy Institute and is a board member of the Electric Power Research Institute. He is on the board at Ford Motor Company and serves on the listed member advisory board for the New York Stock Exchange. In the past, he has served on the boards of Masco Corporation, Comerica Bank, and Mutual of America Capital Management.

His commitment to the community includes memberships on the boards of United Way Bay Area and The Exploratorium, a science, arts, and human perception museum based in San Francisco. His community service has also been recognized by The Detroit News, and in 2003 he was selected as one of several Michiganians of the Year. Tom Bottorff is Senior Vice President, Regulatory Affairs, at Pacific Gas and Electric Company. Bottorff is responsible for developing, coordinating and managing policy with state and federal regulatory agencies, including the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC), the California Energy Commission (CEC) and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). He also is responsible for developing and filing rate proposals with the CPUC, and for oversight of the company's gas and electric tariffs. Bottorff joined PG&E in 1982 and has served in a number of regulatory, rates and customer service areas prior to his current assignment.

Before joining the utility, Bottorff was a power supply analyst for the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in Washington, D.C. He has also developed and built over 25 new homes in Northern California. Bottorff received a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering from the University of California, Berkeley, and a Master of Science degree in engineering economic systems from Stanford University. He holds both general building and engineering contractor licenses in the state of California.

Bottorff also serves on the board of directors of the Silicon Valley Leadership Group and the Sonoma County Chapter of Habitat for Humanity.

Brian Cherry is Vice President of Regulatory Relations for Pacific Gas and Electric Company. He is responsible for developing, coordinating and managing policy with the California Public Utilities Commission. In addition, he has oversight and responsibility for all California state agencies including the California Energy Commission, the California Air Resources Board, and the California Coastal Commission, among others.

Cherry joined Pacific Gas and Electric Company in 2000 and has served in a variety of capacities in Regulatory Relations, including Vice President of Regulation and Rates. Before joining the utility, he was the lead for the Legal/Regulatory team that created Sempra Energy, the holding company for Southern California Gas Company and San Diego Gas & Electric.
