Catherine – it looks like we have confirmed a Metcalf update with your office next Monday. At that time, we will brief you with the complete deck that was presented by PG&E at the conference in San Jose led by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and Department of Energy (DOE). The redacted deck was prepared in consultation with representatives of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, who asked that certain slides not be made publicly available. I also understand that the Wall Street Journal has made a public records act request to the Commission and that a resolution has been calendared for the March 13 PUC business meeting. While I don't believe this presentation would be subject to that request, there could be future requests of a similar nature.

I've been informed that the San Jose conference was for information sharing with utilities and certain federal and state jurisdictional agencies including law enforcement agencies.
