Per our earlier conversation, SED is supportive of PG&E brining on Exponent to perform analysis of what happened. In particular, SED would be interested in any findings regarding how gas ended up migrating into the house and causing the explosion. It would be great if Exponent can reach out to our lead investigator, Nathaniel Sarina, to discuss what questions SED hopes that Exponent can answer.

To be clear, the Exponent analysis will in no way impact the scope of the SED staff investigation. SED will be following our standard procedure to investigate the explosion at Carmel as a reportable incident.

We are OK with PG&E saying that SED is supportive of PG&E brining on Exponent.
