Dear Supporters,

I am pleased to report that our work with PG&E to develop alternative solutions to its Pipeline Pathways program has taken another small step forward. This afternoon the City of Walnut Creek reached an interim agreement with PG&E under which PG&E has agreed to refrain from (and ensure its agents and contractors refrain from) any non-emergency tree removal activities associated with its gas transmission lines within the City. In addition, PG&E has agreed to suspend proactive communications with property owners relating to non-emergency Pipeline Pathways tree removals. The term of the agreement is six months, and the agreement requires PG&E and the City of Walnut Creek to work together in good faith toward a definitive agreement regarding PG&E's vegetation management activities

within the City.
