Any update on PG&E's meeting request to meet on PG&E's Emergency Mgmt Advancement Program?

Here's more information on the subject of this meeting request from Meredith Allen:

"In 2013, PG&E implemented an initiative to strengthen its capabilities across the Company to respond to catastrophic events. PG&E created a company-wide emergency preparedness and response department. PG&E also adopted the Emergency Management Advancement Program to bring its response processes to industry leading standards over a 2 year time period.

PG&E's approach to a catastrophic event is predicated on our ability to scale and our ability to do so quickly. The purpose of the briefing would be to discuss the improvements in these 2 key areas that PG&E is making through EMAP, such as new damage forecasting capabilities,

scaling restoration requirements, leadership support and logistics, and collapsing lead times for emergency response, restoring community priorities and communicating internally and externally.”
