Sorry to get this to you so late in the day. Here are the effect on residential rates

-The forecasted system average bundled rates are 17.0 cents per kwhr for October 1 and 17.6 cents per kwhr on January 1, 2015

-The bundled residential rates are 17.4 cents per kwhr for October 1 and 17.9 cents per kwhr on January 1, 2015

The assumptions in this forecast are

1. The GRC PD revenue requirements fro electric. The uncollected 2014 RRQ balance (January through September, 2014) is amortized over 2015 and 2016

2. The ERRA application as filed

3. Partial implementation of nuclear decommissioning on October 1 and full implementation on January 1 with recovery of the uncollected 2014 balance.

All other revenue requirements for test year and balancing accounts are held constant.
