Terrie –

Hi there. Laura asked me to help out with this question.

Yes, those are mostly our lights. The imperfect rule of thumb is that the ones on wooden poles in that neighborhood are PG&E, and that the ones on metal poles are City of San Francisco. I've been told that the lion's share in Bayview are PG&E.

A lot of cities are asking this question right now about PG&E lights and city-owned lights, and we have been working with all of them. The GRC draft decision even includes a section that deals with the switch to LEDs for PG&E lights.

If you'd like, I could have our Government Relations person on this, Redacted, reach out to this person to talk about possibilities. He has been working with the City of San Francisco on this.
