1. Disaster

On July 2, 2014, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) issued a Fire Management Assistance Declaration the California Butts (IFIM e5057) under the Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistant 42 U.S.C. sections 5121-5206, proclaiming a state of emerge Mappin County. The wildfire damaged private residences and outbuildings aimeath and required evacuations.

2. Effects on PG&E'sFacilities

To date, the wildfire has damaged 8 delistortholdion lifetices throughout Napa County. The wildfire is estimated to have distribution 241 customers.

3. Estimated Restoration Costs

PG& Eestimates it has incurred approxite 364.0622/263 of incremental costs due to the wildfire, of which \$103,936 is estimated ital beelaated \$4263,327 is estimated to

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be expense related. PG&E continues to assess the total repair and restoration costs incurred and will supplement this letter should further damage be identified.
