## NOTES:

- 1. All telephonic reports for incidents of types 1, 2, and 3 are to reach the General Office within 1 1/2 hours during normal working hours and 3 hours outside normal after PG&E is notified and PG&E personnel are on the scene. If the information is incomplete at that time, furnish the available information and furnish the missing information in a supplement report.
- 2. All telephonic reports for incidents of types 1,2, and 3 are to be made to one of the CPUC representatives as directed on the CPUC reporting list. CPUC representatives are to be telephoned at their office number during normal office hours or at their homes outside of normal working hours. If none of the CPUC representatives can be reached during normal working hours, leave a message on the office recorder stating the time of the incident, time of the call, location of the incident, a detailed description of the incident and the name and telephone number where you can be reached immediately at any time. If none of the CPUC representatives can be reached outside or normal working hours, leave a message with the same information as described above on the home recorder of at least one of the CPUC representatives.
- 3. All faxes to the CPUC are to be submitted on the CPUC form "Report of Gas Leak or Interruption", CPUC File No. 410. All faxes are to be submitted to the CPUC by the end of the next working day by the Distribution Department.
- 4. Written reports shall include the appropriate DOT form (RSPA F7100.1 for distribution and DOT form RSPA F7100.2 for transmission and gathering systems) and a letter of explanation giving a more detailed account of the incident. The CPUC may waive the requirement for the letter. The DOT receives the form only.
- 5. Incidents on Gathering Lines outside of the limits of any incorporated or unincorporated city, town, or village or any designated residential or commercial area such as a subdivision, business or shopping center, or community development are reportable to the CPUC only.
- 6. Incidents reportable to the DOT, incidents that are major newsworthy events, service interruptions over 2500 customer hours, and newsworthy events when implementation of PG&E's tariffs may be related to injury or death of a PG&E customer, are to be reported to the CPUC Commission Advisory and Compliance Division Energy Branch during working hours or during the next available working hours for those incidents that occur during nonworking hours.
- 7. Incidents that are major newsworthy events, service interruption over 2500 customer hours, and newsworthy events when implementation of PG&E's tariffs may be related to injury or death of a PG&E customer, are to be reported to the Executive Director of the CPUC during working hours or during the next available working hours for those incidents that occur during nonworking hours.
