2.1 Performance-Based Qualification

2.1.1 Introduction

This part contains performance-based evaluation templates. The templates are used when assessing the skill and knowledge levels of potential and incumbent individuals who will perform covered tasks on gas pipeline facilities without the supervision of a person qualified to perform the covered tasks.

Covered task is defined as a task that is:

- performed on a pipeline facility;
- an operations or maintenance task;
- performed pursuant to a requirement in
 49 CFR Part 192 or Part 195; and
- affects the operation or integrity of the pipeline.

2.1.2 Initial Qualification–Job Performance Evaluations

Initial Qualification is the qualification, completed at any time, for individuals who were not performing a covered task on a regular basis prior to the effective date of the Operator Qualification Rule, August 27, 1999.

This process requires the functional department and/or HR_-Learning Services to observe and complete a job performance evaluation before a person performs a covered task. Local supervision may perform Initial Evaluation upon approval of SGOQPC.

2.1.3 Subsequent Qualification—Job Performance Evaluations

Subsequent Qualification is the qualification completed after a transitional or initial qualification. No subsequent qualification will be done before the compliance date of the Operator Qualification Rule, October 28, 2002. Subsequent qualification is done at an interval defined in Part 1, 1.2.6.1.

This process requires the functional department and/or HR_-Learning Services to observe and complete a job performance evaluation for employees who perform covered tasks. Local supervision may perform Subsequent Evaluation upon approval of SGOQPC.

2.1.5 Intervals

Employees will be required to re-qualify for covered tasks as scheduled not to exceed five (5) years.

2.2 Roles and Responsibilities

2.2.1 System Gas Operator Qualification Plan Coordinator

The Director of Gas Distribution & Technical Services appoints a company SGOQPC who is responsible for:

- maintaining the PG&E Gas Operator Qualification Plan and its policies on a company level
- · reviewing the plan periodically and updating it as needed

2.2.2 Local Gas Operator Qualification Plan Coordinator

The LGOQPC is responsible for contacting the SGOQPC, their functional department, and HR_-Learning Services when:

- adding individuals to the plan
- · removing individuals to the plan
- reasons exist to suspect an individual performing a covered task may have contributed to an incident

2.2.3 Local Supervision

Local supervision is responsible for conducting a qualification evaluation when:

- adding individuals to the plan
- reasons exist to suspect that an individual performing a covered task may have contributed to an incident.
- reasons exist to support that an individual is no longer qualified to perform covered tasks
