## ADVICE 110-W (U 338-W)

## PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DIVISION OF WATER AND AUDITS

**SUBJECT:** Update to the Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee

In compliance with Resolution M-4839, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits to the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) the following changes to its tariffs for water service on Santa Catalina Island. The revised tariff sheets are listed on Attachment A and are attached hereto.

## **PURPOSE**

This advice letter revises SCE's Schedule UF-W, *Surcharge to Fund Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee*, to reflect a decrease in the Public Utilities Commission Reimbursement Fee (PUCRF).

### BACKGROUND

The PUCRF was established by the California legislature in 1983 to fund the regulation of public utilities by the Commission. The Commission determines the level of fees necessary to fund its annual budget and to maintain a reserve.

Section 431 of the Public Utilities Code provides:

"The commission shall annually determine a fee to be paid by every electrical, gas, telephone, telegraph, water, sewer system, and heat corporation and every other public utility providing service directly to customers and subscribers and subject to the jurisdiction of the commission other than a railroad, except as provided in Article 2 (commencing with Section 421). The annual fee shall be established to produce a total amount equal to that amount established in the authorized commission budget for the same year, including adjustments for increases in employee compensation, other increases appropriated by the Legislature, and an appropriate reserve to regulate public utilities..."

After determining the total budget requirement to be recovered through the PUCRF, the Commission allocates fees to the classes of public utilities based on the resources required to regulate each class.

Section 432 of the Public Utilities Code provides:

"The fee allocation among classes of public utilities shall reflect expenditures by the commission on regulatory and other authorized activities affecting each respective class, and shall bear the same ratio that the commission's workload for each class of public utility subject to the fee bears to the commission's total workload for all public utilities subject to the fee."

## PROPOSED TARIFF CHANGES

On January 10, 2019, the Commission adopted Resolution M-4839 (the Resolution), which sets forth the levels of PUCRF effective April 1, 2019. As a result, the currently effective PUCRF surcharge of 1.40% is decreased to 1.23% of revenue and is reflected within SCE's Schedule UF-W.

This advice letter will decrease rates for all applicable customers, but will not cause the withdrawal of service or conflict with any other schedule or rule.

No cost information is required for this advice letter.

## TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to General Order (GO) 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(3), this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

### EFFECTIVE DATE

Pursuant to the Resolution, the changes submitted in this advice letter will become effective on April 1, 2019.
