REQUEST

By AL 21-W, Slide Inn requests permission to file the above tariff sheets in compliance with GRC Resolution W-5225 ordering paragraph 2 for Escalation year 2021 approved by the Commission on June 25, 2020. This filing is the 3rd of 3 increases authorized for \$25,892 or 24.98% for Test Year 2021. See attached Appendix A approved by Resolution W-5225 for Escalation Year 2021.

BACKGROUND

The present rate became effective on January 1, 2021 pursuant to Resolution W-5225 which authorized a step 2 of 3 GRC increases for Test Year 2020.

The last general rate increase became effective on June 25, 2020 pursuant to Resolution W-5225, which authorized 3 Escalation Years 2019, 2020, and 2021 a general rate increase of \$19,142 or 30.79%, \$22,326 or 27.46%, and \$25,892 or 24.98% for a final return on rate base of 10.4% with Escalation Year 2021.

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TIER DESIGNATION AND REQUESTED EFFECTIVE DATE

This AL and the enclosed tariff sheets are submitted pursuant to General Order (GO.) 96-B. AL 21-W is designated as a Tier 1 AL to be effective on January 1, 2022.¹

NOTICE

This AL does not require customer notice as this is a compliance AL in accordance with Resolution W-5225, approved on June 25, 2020. A copy of this AL has been served to all parties listed on the service list² on the last page of this AL. This filing will not cause withdrawal of service nor conflict with any other schedule or rule.

RESPONSE OR PROTEST³

Anyone may respond to or protest this AL. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A protest objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility.

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest. The Water Division must receive a response or protest via email (or postal mail)

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

REPLIES

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by DWA within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.⁴
