TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Bass Lake Water Company (Bass Lake) hereby transmits for filing one digital copy of this advice letter 87-W and the various attachments which are enclosed:

REQUEST

Bass Lake hereby requests authority to increase and convert its previously authorized \$4.6 million State Revolving Fund Loan (SRF) by \$8,119,082, to a new 20-year loan totaling \$12,730,882, to cover the actual bid cost for the projected construction portion of the project including \$1,857,526 for contingency/cost escalation, because of the volatile construction and material markets.

BACKGROUND

Decision 93-11-066 authorized Class C and D water utilities to file to incur long-term debt by advice letter rather than by formal application. The intent was to simplify and speed the granting of loan authorizations.

This loan request is made pursuant to Sections 816 through 851 and other relevant sections of the Public Utilities Code and General order 96-B.

By advice letter 71-W, and Resolution W-5167 dated May 31, 2018, Bass Lake was authorized to borrow \$4.6 million in SRF funds to cover 100% of the pre-bid project cost. Bass Lake is in the process of seeking approval of a new loan agreement for the increased construction cost and contingency for a total loan amount of \$12,730,882. Also, Bass Lake is working on the loan details to cover 100% of the project cost at an anticipated 1.8% interest rate to be paid back over 20-years, however, that amount, and term could change. For this reason, Bass Lake respectfully requests Commission authorization for the 1.8% subject to change by final SRF loan terms. As a part of this loan agreement a longer amortization period and loan forgiveness potential are also being discussed with other staff.

It is requested that approval for a customer surcharge be granted in accordance with the supporting documents attached.

Bass Lake provides water service to 1,013 customers (44 metered customers and 969 flat rate customers) on the northwest shore of Bass Lake including the Falls and Bass Lake and vicinity in Madera County.

The proceeds from the loan will be used to finance replacement of Bass Lake's water system surface water treatment plant that no longer meets the standards for surface water treatment. Design, environmental documentation, and permitting from the US Forest Service and other regulatory agencies has been in process for nearly 10 years and now is complete. The environmental documentation was recently updated as the original environmental document had expired. Specific components of the new treatment plant are reflected in the attached bid sheet summary. The lowest bidder was Clark Bros at \$8,845,360 and Bass Lake intends to do a conditional bid award initially using proceeds from the original \$4.6 million SRF loan to make payments thereby avoiding waiting until next spring to start and further delaying this mandated project.

Bass Lake estimates that it will need \$760,811.52 per year for the first 10 years to make principal and interest payments plus the accumulation of a required 10% reserve (\$76,081.15), totaling \$836,892.67 per year.

The current monthly bill for a residential flat rate customer with a ¾-inch service connection would increase by \$61.63 from \$79.75 to \$141.38 or 77.3% for the first 10 years and by \$56.02 or 70.2% thereafter. Of Bass Lake's 1,013 service connections, 977 or 96.4% are ¾-inch flat-rate customers.

The current monthly bill for a typical $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch commercial metered customer using approximately 15,000 gallons of water (at a quantity rate of \$1.775 per 100 cubic feet, 20 HCF each) would increase by \$61.63 from \$75.39 (\$35.50 + 39.89) to \$137.03 or 81.7% for the first 10 years and by \$56.02 or 74.3% thereafter.

Bass Lake asks the Public Utilities Commission to approve and issue a Resolution:

- 1. Granting Bass Lake all necessary authority to borrow \$12,730,882 million under the SRF loan program to finance the treatment plant indicated in this advice letter.
- 2. To implement a surcharge to repay the loan.
- 3. Incumber utility assets in connection with the loan.
- 4. Granting such other and additional relief as the Commission may deem appropriate.

BACKGROUND

The present rates became effective on June 9, 2021, pursuant to Resolution W-4540, which authorized an offset (CPI) rate increase of 1.4%.

The last general rate increase by Resolution W-4544 dated June 30, 2005, authorized an increase of \$194,975 or 63.16% with an annual rate of margin of 24% or a 12.15% Rate of

Return on Rate Base. A Rate Base Offset became effective on March 9, 2009, pursuant to Resolutions W-4741 and W-4735.

NOTICE TO CUSTOMERS OF PROPOSED SURCHARGE

September 2, 2021

The **Bass Lake Water Company** (Bass Lake) has requested authority from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) by Advice Letter (AL) 87-W to increase and re-authorize its previously authorized \$4,611,800 (20-year loan at 1.7% interest) State Revolving Fund Loan (SRF) by \$8,119,082 to a new 20-year loan at 1.8% interest totaling \$12,730,882, to cover the actual bid cost for the projected construction portion of the project including \$1,857,526 for contingency/cost escalation, because of the volatile construction and material markets and to impose a surcharge on all customers in accordance with meter size to repay the loan. When necessary, the surcharge shall be adjusted pursuant to the SRF loan agreement.

The California State Water Board has mandated the construction of a new surface water treatment facility as the current facility does not have the capacity to meet the summer seasonal water demands and is not capable of treating water to today's surface water treatment standard. The proposed loan will fund the cost of this new treatment plant.

Bass Lake estimates that it will need \$760,811.52 per year for the first 10 years to make principal and interest payments plus the accumulation of a required 10% reserve (\$76,081.15), totaling \$836,892.67 per year and \$760,811.52 per year from the 11th to the 20th year of the loan.

The current monthly bill for a residential flat rate customer with a ¾-inch service connection would increase by \$61.63 from \$79.75 to \$141.38 or 77.3% for the first 10 years and by \$56.02 or 70.2% for the remaining 10 years of the loan. Of Bass Lake's 1,013 service connections, 977 or 96.4% are ¾-inch flat-rate customers.

The current monthly bill for a typical ³/₄-inch commercial metered customer using approximately 15,000 gallons of water (at a quantity rate of \$1.775 per 100 cubic feet, 20 HCF each) would increase by \$61.63 from \$75.40 (\$39.90 + \$35.50) to \$137.03 or 81.7% for the first 10 years and by \$56.02 or 74.3% thereafter.

As a part of this loan agreement discussions a longer amortization period and loan forgiveness potential are also being discussed with other staff. These are potential avenues Bass Lake is looking at to potential reduce these overall costs to the customers.

Subject: Loan Request

This is a follow-up to our meeting last Friday during which we discussed the status of our SWTP project and the need for additional funds due to unexpectedly higher bid prices for the project. Also In attendance were representatives from the Division of Drinking Water (DDW) and the California Public Utilities Commission (PUC). It was stated your Division would require 2-3 months to review, approve and issue a Loan Amendment for the needed increase and the PUC would need at least 90 days thereafter to review and authorize the increased loan and revised customer surcharge. This timeframe for project funding approval would result in a late spring construction start due to our winter weather conditions resulting in an 8-9 month delay and likely higher project costs.

In the meeting an alternate approach was discussed which would allow us to begin construction next month. This would enable the initial site work to be completed in dry conditions this fall before winter conditions set in, and perhaps more importantly, allow the work on the intake portion in the creek bed to be done during the annual low flow early-fall period as planned and as is necessary for this work. An alternate funding source to permit this preferred and more cost-effective schedule to proceed is to allow the use of funds from our already approved funding.

Attached is a summary of the currently approved funding of \$4,611,800 itemized by Activity. So far we have received \$712,549.00 in loan advances which have paid for design, engineering and a partial payment on the membrane filter which is nearly complete and due to be delivered late this month or early next. The funds for the Facilities Planning and Design have been fully used and soon the Prepurchased Materials category will be spent for the filter. However, the \$2,765,800 in the Components/Facilities Construction activity is available and could be utilized to fund the initial work by the award of a Conditional Construction Contract with our low bid contractor. Therefore we request your approval to utilize all these remaining funds for this purpose.

We experienced significant permitting delays with the U.S. Forest Service on this project in the past but continued to work diligently and in good faith to conform to DDW's requirement to provide better filtration to our system. We are finally in a position to start construction before costs accelerate even further but need your assistance in this interim period to keep this moving along. The Contractor has agreed to extend the bid award date from this Friday, August 13^t, to the 27th to allow time for you to process this request. Therefore your our timely review would be appreciated.

We realize this is an interim step as we still need the loan amount increased as we discussed and as outlined in my Memo dated July 15, 2021 (as revised July 26, 2021). I will send a separate email addressing this tomorrow.

If you need any further information, please let us know. We will also upload this letter to FAAST.
