## **ADVICE 124-W** (U 338-W)

PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA WATER DIVISION

SUBJECT: Establishment of the Catalina Water Pipeline Assessment

Memorandum Account to Track and Record Environmental-

Remediation Costs for the Catalina Water Utility

In compliance with Ordering Paragraph (OP) 1 of Decision (D.)21-02-009 (D.21-09-009 or the Decision) dated February 11, 2021, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits to the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) the following changes to its tariffs for water service on Santa Catalina Island. The revised tariff sheets are listed on Attachment A and are attached hereto.

## **PURPOSE**

This advice letter establishes Preliminary Statement Part S, Catalina Water Pipeline Assessment Memorandum Account (CWPAMA), of SCE's Water Tariffs pursuant to OP 1 of D.21-02-009.

### **BACKGROUND**

SCE's Catalina Water operations is a Class C utility serving approximately 2,000 customer accounts across Santa Catalina Island. 

1 SCE acquired the Catalina water utility in 1962<sup>2</sup> and is the sole water purveyor on the island, providing potable water service to approximately 4,100 residents and 1 million annual visitors to the island.

On January 28, 2020, SCE submitted Advice 116-W seeking authority to establish a memorandum account to record and track all environmental remediation costs relating to the identification, characterization, removal, and disposal of decommissioned pipe throughout the Catalina water system.

D.64420, OP 1. SCE also acquired Catalina gas and electric utility operations.

On February 26, 2020, the Commission's Water Division suspended Advice 116-W, and indicated that SCE's request be reviewed through a formal application. On April 13, 2020, SCE filed Application (A.)20-04-010 requesting establishment of the CWPAMA with a narrowed scope and updated cost estimate.

On February 11, 2021, the Commission approved D.21-02-009, authorizing SCE to establish a memorandum account to track the costs to perform a system-wide assessment of Catalina water utility infrastructure. The Decision authorized an effective date of April 13, 2020 for the memorandum account,<sup>4</sup> the same date SCE filed its application. Finally, the Decision authorized SCE to submit a Tier 1 advice letter to establish the CWPAMA.<sup>5</sup>

## **PROPOSED TARIFF CHANGES**

In accordance with the discussion above, SCE is establishing Preliminary Statement Part S – Catalina Water Pipeline Assessment Memorandum Account.<sup>6</sup>

## TIER DESIGNATION

Pursuant to General Order (GO) 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(3) and OP 1 of D.21-02-009, this advice letter is submitted with a Tier 1 designation.

## **EFFECTIVE DATE**

Pursuant to OP 2 of D.21-02-009, the effective date of this advice letter and tariffs is April 13, 2020.

- S. Catalina Water Pipeline Assessment Memorandum Account (CWPAMA)
  - 1. Purpose

The purpose of the Catalina Water Pipeline Assessment Memorandum Account (CWPAMA) is to track and record costs associated with SCE's completion of an island-wide assessment of SCE's Catalina water distribution system, including both in-service and decommissioned pipelines, for the presence of certain hazardous materials (polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs) and asbestos) regulated under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA) and South Coast Air Quality Management District.

2. **Applicability** 

> The CWPAMA will be recovered by customer classes that the Commission designates in its discretion in connection with the proceeding resolving the reasonableness review.

- 3. **Definitions** 
  - a. In-service pipeline: actively supports distribution of water to customers, including stand-by or emergency functions;
  - b. Out-of-service pipeline: decommissioned (abandoned) pipe no longer in-service and not supporting distribution of water to customers;
  - c. Re-purposed pipeline: pipe no longer in-service and has been re-purposed for another use, such as a culvert or retaining wall, etc.; and
  - d. Legacy pipeline: pipe not currently connected to the active distribution system, but can be returned to service, if needed.
- 4. Operation of the CWPAMA

The following entries will be recorded monthly (if applicable) to the CWPAMA:

A debit entry equal to the recorded costs associated with performing an assessment of the entire Catalina water distribution system, including, but not limited to:

Desktop assessment - compiling existing physical and electronic records, drawing review, and identifying location and accessibility of water pipeline;

  - 4. Operation of the CWPAMA (Continued)
    - b. Field assessment biological/archaeological surveys and monitoring, agency notification and permit preparation, investigation of system areas unable to be verified during the desktop assessment, field sampling of distribution system infrastructure (in-service, out-of-service, re-purposed, and legacy) including surrounding soils: and
    - c. Report preparation summary of findings, map/diagram indicating locations and categories, material composition, and accessibility, and supporting documentation.
  - 5. Interest

Interest expense shall accrue monthly in the CWPAMA by applying one-twelfth of the most recent Federal Reserve three-month Commercial Paper Rate - nonfinancial, from the Federal Reserve's Statistical Release H.15 (expressed as an annual rate) to the average monthly balance in the CWPAMA. If a nonfinancial rate is not published by the Federal Reserve in a given month, SCE shall use the Federal Reserve's threemonth Commercial Paper Rate - financial.

6. Disposition

> Costs recorded in the CWPAMA may be recovered in rates only after a request by SCE, a showing of reasonableness, and approval by the Commission. Disposition of the amounts recorded in the CWPAMA shall be requested in accordance with General Order 96-B, Water Industry Rule 7.3.3(7) and Standard Practice U-27-W; SCE's next General Rate Case application; or other ratesetting request designated by the Commission.
