**ADVICE LETTER NO. 1368** 

#### TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

California-American Water Company (U210W) (California American Water) submits this advice letter applicable to its Northern Division water customers.

#### Purpose:

The purpose of this advice letter is to update the unit costs for the West Placer Special Facilities Fee and applicable preliminary statement to reflect water connection charges effective 1/1/2022.

#### **Background:**

California American Water filed Advice Letter ("AL") 1124 on April 15, 2016 seeking to establish a Special Facilities Fee and an associated memorandum account to pass through the cost of new service connections per agreement with the Placer County Water Agency for water supply. Resolution W-5111 ordered as follows:

- 1. California-American Water Company's Advice Letter 1124 requesting Commission authorization to establish the Special Facilities Fee Memorandum Account for its Sacramento service area is approved as set forth in this Resolution. The Preliminary Statement for the new memorandum account is attached to this Resolution as Appendix A.
- 2. California-American Water Company's Advice Letter 1124 requesting Commission authorization to establish the Special Facilities Fee Schedule for its Sacramento service area is approved as set forth in this Resolution. The Special Facilities Fee Schedule is attached to this Resolution as Appendix B.
- 3. The Special Facilities Fee Memorandum Account and Special Facilities Fee Schedule attached in Appendices A and B, respectively, are adopted. The effective date of the Memorandum Account and Special Facilities Fee Schedule is the effective date of this Resolution.

California American Water filed Advice Letter 1124-A on October 28, 2016 to implement the tariffs approved in Resolution W-5111.

In February 2022, California American Water received an updated Water Connection Charge schedule from Placer County Water Agency with unit capacity costs effective January 1, 2022.

#### Request:

Update unit capacity costs for applicable tariffs based on the water connection charges effective January 1, 2022.

#### **Tier Designation:**

This advice letter is submitted pursuant to General Order No. 96-B and is designated as a Tier 1 filing.

#### **Effective Date:**

California American Water requests an effective date of January 1, 2022.

#### Service List:

- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility. A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

DWA must receive a response or protest via email (<u>or</u> postal mail) within 20 days of the date the AL is filed. When submitting a response or protest, <u>please include the utility name and advice letter number in the subject line.</u>

The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

#### **REPLIES**<sup>3</sup>

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by DWA within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL.

The actions requested in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

This filing will not cause the withdrawal of service, nor conflict with other schedules or rules.
