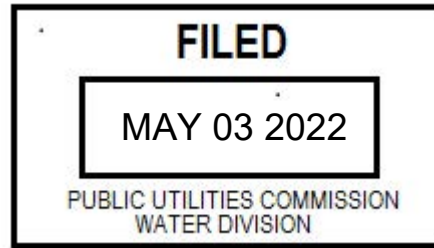

These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Order Nos. 96-B, and pursuant to the authority established by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) in Decision No. (D.) 16-06-004, dated June 9, 2016.

SJWC requests authorization to increase revenue requirement by \$232,355 via a rate base offset for plant additions related to the Franciscan Station Pumps.

This advice letter is designated as a Tier 2 Advice Letter consistent with D.16-06-004. Public notice is not required as notice was completed at the time of SJWC’s filing of General Rate Case Application No. (A.) 15-01-002. These tariffs are submitted pursuant to General Orders (GO) No. 96-B Water Industry Rules 7.3.3(8) which provides that “a rate base offset will be disposed of under Tier 2 when staff determines that:

- i. The Rate base offset was previously approved by the Commission in a decision or resolution;
- ii. The project scope is consistent with what the Commission approved; and
- iii. The Commission approval included a budget cap and the rate base offset request is at or below the budget cap.”

Background

In D.16-06-004, the Commission approved the settlement agreement between the Public Advocates Office (formerly Office of Ratepayers Advocates) in SJWC's A.15-01-002. In the Settlement, Cal Advocates and SJWC agreed on the need for improvement projects at the Franciscan Station pumps and that the project cap of \$1,530,700 would be recovered via a Tier 2 Advice Letter filing.

D.16-06-004, Attachment B Settlement Agreement II.A.3.a states:

“Parties agree to advice letter treatment (Tier II) for the Franciscan Station Pumps project with an advice letter budget cap of \$1,530,700. All project costs, including, but not limited to, contract costs, materials, company labor, consulting fees, company overhead, taxes, insurance, permitting fees, and capitalized interest may be included in the advice letter filing. The advice letter will be filed only upon project completion. ORA reserves the right to review the advice letter filing for reasonable and prudent costs. In the event that final project costs are greater than the advice letter budget cap SJWC reserve the right to see recovery of the overage in a subsequent general rate case.”

The project is currently complete and used and useful. The total cost is \$4,086,908¹; however SJWC is only requesting to include the cap amount of \$1,530,700 in this advice letter. The overage will be included in SJWC's next general rate case filing.

Revenue Requirement

The revenue requirement for this authorized capital project is \$232,355.

Effective Date

SJWC requests that the updated tariff sheets become effective July 1, 2022, to coincide with the rate change for the anticipated Valley Water wholesale water increases effective the same date to minimize customer confusion. If approved, this rate change will be additive to the wholesale water increase advice letter filing.

Protests and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response does not oppose the filing but presents information that may prove useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds may include the following:

1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
2. The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
3. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
4. The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
5. The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;

6. The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
7. The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
8. The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

If a distribution main of adequate size to serve a private fire protection system, in addition to all other normal service, does not exist in the street or alley adjacent to the premises to be served, then a service main from the nearest existing main of adequate capacity shall then be installed by the utility and the cost paid by applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
3. Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction, are installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Fire Underwriters for protection against theft, leakage or waste of water and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
