#### **REQUEST**

By AL 86-W, Sonora Water Resources requests permission to increase its revenues (based on increase to the present monthly quantity rate and service charge) by 3.4%, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for 2023. This projected revenue increase of \$11,040 will not result in a rate of margin which exceeds the authorized rate of margin. Workpapers justifying this increase are enclosed.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The present rates became effective on March 22, 2023 with Advice Letter No. 84-W pursuant to D.92-03-093 (2022 CPI).

The last informal general rate increase became effective on February 20, 2022, pursuant to GO 96-B, which authorized a general rate increase of \$86,385 or 36.55%.

AL 86-W is filed pursuant to Ordering Paragraphs No. 1 of Decision 92-03-093 and Resolution W-4493, which authorize Class C and D water and sewer utilities to file a request for a CPI increase once a year by AL. The increase is to be passed on to the utility's customers in their quantity rate and service charge.

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#### TIER DESIGNATION AND REQUESTED EFFECTIVE DATE

This AL and the enclosed tariff sheets are submitted pursuant to General Order (GO) 96-B. This AL is designated as a Tier 1 AL and the enclosed tariff sheets will become effective upon filing.<sup>1</sup>

# **NOTICE**

This AL does not require notice;<sup>2</sup> however, the utility shall inform its customers, by bill insert in the first bill that includes the increase, of the amount of the increase expressed in dollar and percentage terms.<sup>3</sup> A copy of this AL has been serviced to all parties listed on the service list<sup>4</sup> on the last page of this AL. This filling will not cause withdrawal of service nor conflict with any other schedule or rule.

# **RESPONSE OR PROTEST<sup>5</sup>**

Anyone may respond to or protest this AL. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the AL. A protest objects to the AL in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- 1. The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the AL;
- 2. The relief requested in the AL would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- 3. The analysis, calculations, or data in the AL contain material error or omission;
- 4. The relief requested in the AL is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- 5. The relief requested in the AL requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the AL process; or
- 6. The relief requested in the AL is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

A protest may not rely on policy objections to an AL where the relief requested in the AL follows rules or directions established by statute or Commission order applicable to the utility.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform DWA, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

#### REPLIES

The utility shall reply to each protest and may reply to any response. Any reply must be received by DWA within five business days after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day on each person who filed the protest or response to the AL. <sup>6</sup>

# Schedule No. 4 PRIVATE FIRE PROTECTION SERVICE

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Applicable to all water service furnished to privately owned fire protection systems.

#### **TERRITORY**

Fairway Acres and vicinity, located approximately one mile east of Jamestown in Tuolumne County.

#### **RATES**

For each inch of diameter of service connection: \$ 15.15 (I)

#### SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- (1) The fire protection service connection shall be installed by the utility and the cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
- (2) The minimum diameter for the private service connection shall be four inches and the maximum diameter shall not be more than the diameter of the water main to which the service is connected.
- (3) If a distribution main of adequate size to serve a private fire protection system in addition to all other normal service does not exist in the street or alley adjacent to the premises to be served, then a service main from the nearest existing main of adequate capacity shall be installed by the utility and the cost paid by the applicant. Such cost will not be subject to refund.
- (4) Service hereunder is for private fire protection systems to which no connections for other than fire protection purposes are allowed and which are regularly inspected by the underwriters having jurisdiction are installed according to specifications of the utility, and are maintained to the satisfaction of the utility. The utility may install the standard detector type meter approved by the Board of Underwriters for protection agains theft, leakage, or waste of water and with cost paid by the applicant. Such payment shall not be subject to refund.
