CA-6 I98-04-010 - Investigation into the operations and practices of the San Diego Gas and Electric Company in connection with its compliance with requirements to maintain proper clearance between power lines and vegetation.

This decision grants William Adams an award of \$3,031.20 in compensation for his contribution to D98-12-025. This proceeding is closed.

This decision confirms Daniel P. Garcia to serve on the committee of Edison's Nuclear Decommissioning Trust Funds. This proceeding is closed. (Exam Clanon)

∠CA-8 A98-07-046 - Sereno Del Mar Water Company (Sereno) and Russian River Utility.

For authority to sell and Russian River Utility, a California Corporation to buy the water system in Sonoma County. This decision authorizes Russian River Utility, a management company well experienced in operating district and mutual systems (and Court appointed receiver for Sereno since 1995) to acquire all stock and control of Sereno from former owner's estate trust. This decision further approves Sereno Advice Letter 21 to regularize an unauthorized deviation from Sereno's tariff main extension rule to allow Sereno to retain \$161,500 received from 19 willing contributors to pay for Department of Health Services mandated water supply/storage facilities now under construction; this additional plant at no cost to the presently connected 108 customers allows 19 additional customers to receive water. This decision also recognizes the probability of conversion to Operating Ratio Method for return in view of meager rate base, and future use of low cost state loan to finance anticipated Department of Health Services requirement of a filtration plant. CA-9 A99-06-003 - Pacific Centrex Services, LLC.

For authority to provide resold local exchange services in California. This decision grants Pacific Centrex Services, LLC a certificate of public convenience and necessity to resell local exchange telecommunications services. This proceeding is closed.

For approval of a pro forma change of control and transfer of a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) under Section 854 of the Public Utilities Code. This decision grants Pacific Fiber Link, L.L.C.'s, a facilitiesbased nondominant interexchange carrier, request of a change in control and approval of a transfer of Pacific Fiber Link's CPCN to its successor organization, Worldwide Fiber Networks, Inc. This decision grants Northstate Airport Shuttle, Inc.'s request to operate as a scheduled passenger stage corporation between the cities of Redding, Anderson, Red Bluff, Corning, Orland, and Willows, on the one hand, and Sacramento International Airport, on the other hand. This proceeding is closed.

The Commission authorizes GTEC by Resolution T-16061 on August 1, 1997 on a provisional basis for a two-year period, to make such changes effective on a five-day notice. This decision grants CWS's Petition for Modification of D96-10-062 to extend the period of authorization to December 31, 2001. This proceeding is closed.

However, the issues addressed in TURN's presentation will be considered in a future phase of this proceeding pertaining to Public Utilities Code Section 709.2. TURN may renew its current request for compensation once there is a final decision in that phase.

This decision establishes prices for unbundled network elements (UNEs) offered by Pacific Bell (Pacific). Among other things, the decision (1) concludes that prices for all of Pacific's UNEs should be set at the applicable Total Element Long Run Incremental Costs adopted in D98-02-106 plus a markup of 19% to cover shared and common costs, (2) rejects arguments by AT&T Communications of California, Inc. and MCI Telecommunications Corporation that Yellow Page revenues and Pacific's draw from the California High Cost Fund-B should be used to lower UNE prices for residential loops, (3) requires Pacific to continue providing UNE combinations in accordance with the terms of existing interconnection agreements until the Federal Communications Commission has completed its work on the issues remanded to it by the Supreme Court in AT&T Corp. v. *Iowa Utilities Bd.* (AT&T – *Iowa*), 119 S.Ct. 721 (1999), (4) concludes that Pacific should not be required to file tariffs applicable to UNEs, and (5) establishes price floors for the local exchange services specified in D96-03-020. The decision acknowledges that several issues related to UNE pricing remain unsettled in light of the Supreme Court's decision in AT&T - Iowa, including the nature of the geographic deaveraging that will be required, and the identity of the network elements that Pacific and other incumbent local exchange carriers will ultimately be required to offer under the Telecommunications Act. The decision concludes that notwithstanding this uncertainty, the most appropriate course of action here is to set prices for the UNEs covered in existing interconnection agreements, and not to attempt to set geographically-deaveraged prices at this time.

This decision authorizes Pacific Bell to increase its DA price floor from \$0.25 to \$0.35, tariff price from \$0.25 to \$0.46, and ceiling rate to \$0.46. Pacific Bell's monthly DA allowance call for residential customers is decreased from five to three calls, for business customers is decreased from two to zero, and Centrex business customers is decreased from one to zero. Pacific Bell's Busy Line Verification (BLV) and Emergency Interrupt (EI) service price floors are increased to cover costs as set forth in sealed Exhibit G. The tariff price is increased from \$0.50 to \$1.20 for BLV and from \$1.00 to \$1.25 for EI. The ceiling rate is capped at \$1.20 for BLV and at \$1.25 for EI. Concurrent with the above-mentioned changes, Pacific Bell is authorized to change its DA, BLV, and EI resale prices to maintain a 17% margin between its retail and resale prices for these services. This proceeding is closed.
