Summary: On May 31, 2000, Mary McDonald, Vice President of California Power Exchange Corporation (CalPX), met with Laura Krannawitter, advisor to Cmmr. Duque, in San Francisco. Also present were: Lisa Urick, Managing Attorney, CalPX; and Karen Mills, Associate Counsel, California Farm Bureau Federation. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Urick described the CalPX's procedural and substantive concerns about the revised alternate order of Cmmrs. Neepner and Bilas. McDonald stated that the Commission should be particularly wary about adopting market structure changes during the transition period. McDonald explained that the multiple exchange proposal as set forth in the revised alternate raised market reliability and consumer protection concerns. McDonald further noted that the advice letter process for qualifying exchanges is flawed. McDonald expressed support for the determination in the revised proposed decision for evaluating the development of the market.

Hoge stated that retention of hydroelectric generating assets within the regulated utility is TURN's preferred policy outcome. Hoge suggested that valuation could be accomplished by using a discounted cash flow analysis with a flow through to ratepayers of revenue beyond an authorized return. Hoge stated that initial valuation would allow an immediate credit to CTC and the revenue flow through would provide additional benefit to ratepayers. Hoge noted that retention holds out the best structural solution for the environmental concerns raised in this proceeding. Hoge also noted advantages to leaving the system in tact with one operator. Hoge also noted that TURN sees the benefit of a compromise that would allow Pacific Gas and Electric Company to hold the hydro assets in an affiliate as long as the affiliate is held to a long term contract that closely mimics regulation with a cost of service component. Hoge stated that TURN envisions that an acceptable model would include a long-term contract with revenue sharing above a specified reasonable return.
