**Summary:** On June 8, 2000, Ed Kurz, Attorney for Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), had a telephone conversation with ALJ Gottstein. In the conversation also participated Joe Lawlor, Senior Resource Analyst, Dave Landes, Power Contracts Supervisor, and Baldwin Chan, Principal Mechanical Engineer, of PG&E. Lawlor described various scenarios on how the PG&E shareholder incentive mechanism would work in relationship to the end of the rate freeze. Lawlor further described a situation wherein the rate-freeze ends early because PG&E has recovered all its transition costs, then PG&E shareholders would receive only the shareholder incentive. Lawlor explained that the benefit to the ratepayers is that the Bridging Agreement cost savings would help the rate freeze end sooner, thereby expediting the transition to the post rate freeze era in which rates are predicted to be lower than current frozen rate levels. Kurz stated that PG&E will provide other examples of restructured qualifying facility agreements which have benefits that occur primarily during the rate freeze.
