Referring to the auction and any alternatives thereto, Roos-Collins and Graff stressed the importance of public disclosure of all such alternatives prior to the close of hearings. Roos-Collins urged the Commission to proceed to the completion of a full environmental review of all alternatives, including the auction, proposed for the disposition of PG&E's hydroelectric generating assets.
