Summary: On June 15, 2000, Jim Scarff, counsel for the Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA), had a telephone conversation with Geoffrey Dryvynsyde, advisor to Cmmr.Lynch. Scarff discussed ORA's view about how Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) new "compromise" proposal, as described in various recent ex-parte notices, fit into the existing schedule. Scarff pointed out that ALJ Hale's ruling directed parties to present any alternative methods of market valuation to be filed June 8, however, PG&E chose not to file any testimony regarding alternatives at that time, and now seeks special consideration of the proposal as an alleged 'settlement'. Scarff stated that ORA's viewed this proposal not as a settlement but rather as new alternate method of market valuation and divestiture. Scarff also explained that PG&E's proposal was highly unlikely to reduce the amount of work the Commission would have to do. Scarff noted that the proposal appears to be contrary to the positions of numerous parties. Scarff stated further that the transfer of the assets out of the regulated utility raised many new, major issues involving affiliate transactions and fairness. Scarff also pointed out that PG&E's proposal was contrary to PG&E's application, thereby raising substantial issues of notice.
