**Summary:** On June 28, 2000 @ 1:30 p.m., at the CPUC in San Francisco, the following representatives of AT&T Communications of California, Inc., met with Commissioner Wood and his Telecommunications Advisor, Jonathan Lakritz, to wit: Rose Johnson and Rick Witherington, both Vice-Presidents, Government Affairs, and Bob Kargoll, Regulatory Director.

Mr. Kargol discussed why the Final Arbitrator's Report erred in not establishing an equivalent reciprocal compensation payment structure between AT&T and Pacific Bell. Ms. Johnson discussed said Report's findings which limit when the alternate dispute resolution process can be used and explained that if said Report's cap is left unchanged, many more contract disputes between AT&T and Pacific Bell will be litigated before the Commission.
