ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This was a proceeding initiated to change the basis for charges used in Distance Table 8 from constructive miles to postal zip code areas. A review of our files indicates that the last docket entry in this proceeding was a proposed decision by retired Administrative Law Judge Lemke filed on November 4, 1988. There have been no formal inquiries as to the status of this matter.

David Gamson, advisor for Cmmr. Neepier, and Michael Hoover, Regulatory Policy and Affairs Manager for Edison, were also there. Foster stated that the Enron motion should be denied as Edison had been fully prepared to provide Enron with a counter-offer to Enron’s proposal to restructure QF contracts by converting them to “brokered power” arrangements. Foster stated that Edison had communicated this fact to Enron before the motion was filed, but Enron broke off negotiations with Edison over a disagreement regarding the terms of a confidentiality agreement. Foster stated that granting the motion

would severely restrict Edison's ability to negotiate restructurings with the QF community that maximize customer savings. Foster stated that Edison was working with many of the same QFs identified by Enron in its motion and with other third parties to restructure above-market contracts and, from Edison's perspective, Enron's motion represents an improper attempt to circumvent the over-all examination of QF restructurings that is pending before the Commission.

Summary: On September 10, 1997, Bruce Foster, Vice President of Regulatory and Policy for Southern California Company (Edison), met with Cmmr. Neep in San Francisco. David Gamson, advisor for Cmmr. Neep, and Michael Hoover, Regulatory Policy and Affairs Manager for Edison, were also there. Foster stated that Edison believes there are no issues of triable fact that should preclude the Commission from granting Edison motion for summary judgment on the capacity "truncation" issue raised by the Commission's Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA). Hoover stated that ORA has not, in its opposition to the motion, identified any triable issues that should delay a favorable decision on the motion. Hoover urged the Commission to grant Edison's motion as quickly as possible. Hoover stated that the pending review in Edison's 1991 ECAC of the reasonableness of Edison's administration of the Mojave Cogeneration contract presents a good example of why the requested OIR/OII is necessary. Hoover stated that adopting ORA's position would result in a substantial increase in the already significant level of litigation between utilities and QFs. Hoover stated that Edison had no opportunity to offset disallowances with superior performance that produces substantial benefit for customers. Hoover stated that these and other factors demonstrate the necessity of Commission review of the standards applicable to QF contract reasonableness proceedings, including an examination of how disallowances should be calculated when imprudent conduct has been shown.
