Summary: On November 7, 1997, John Hughes, manager, regulatory policy and affairs for Southern California Edison Company (Edison), spoke with ALJ Wetzell by telephone. Hughes stated that the creation of two subaccounts in Edison's generation PBR proceeding was unnecessary, distinguishing Edison from Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) where the Helms pumped storage facility represents a large portion of PG&E's hydro plant investment. Hughes stated that in contrast with PG&E, only about \$5 million of the investment at Edison's Eastwood facility is related to Edison's pumped storage. Hughes stated that it is inefficient to require a separate accounting for pumped storage facilities considering the small proportion involved (approximately 1%) of Edison's total hydro investment. Hughes stated that in light of the de minimis investment in pumped storage, the Office of Ratepayer Advocate's position should be rejected.
