Summary: On December 3, 1997, City of San Diego (City) sent a letter dated December 3, 1997, signed by Michael T. Uberuaga, City Manager of City, to each of the Commissioners in San Francisco. The letter is attached to this notice. In the letter, the City indicated that the Commission's actions regarding exemptions from Competition Transition Charges (CTCs) would have a major impact on the City. The City has been developing a number of cogeneration facilities over the past several years. The City, being a public agency, has certain scheduling restraints that are inherent to public work. These facilities are renewable energy sources that will provide power to various City loads. The economic viability of these projects will be placed in jeopardy if the Commission were to rule that customers that take power from new cogeneration facilities that engage in direct transactions to serve new load are subject to CTCs.

Summary: On December 8, 1997, PacifiCorp. initiated a meeting with Cmmr. Duque in San Francisco. Parties present were: Michelle Cooke, adv. to Cmmr. Duque; Anne Eakin, John Bohling, Bruce Hellebuy, Jum Fell, and D.J. Smith, PacifiCorp representatives; Dave Norris, Dan Ahearns, Doug Ponds, and Bill Branch, Sierra Pacific representatives; Pat Schmiege, SoCalWater representative; Dan Carroll, Kirkwood representative; Jonathon Bromson and Chris Danforth, ORA representatives; and Margaret A. Rostker, counsel for Enron. Roster descried Enron's view that Proposed Decision in the Commission proceeding for smaller and multi-jurisdictional utilities for compliance with AB 1890 was, in general, acceptable to Enron. The main concern Enron had was lack of clarity in the Proposed Decision that PacifiCorp's use of the California-Oregon Border price for commodity as a proxy for commodity prices at the PX was incomplete as a basis for the credit that direct access customers should receive in PacifiCorp's territory. Rostker urged the Commission to ensure that associated charges for PX services be factored in to the COB price proxy for commodity to ensure that direct access customers do not pay these charges twice for delivery of power.
