### GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q     **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A     **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS    **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A    Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

On June 25, 1998, Doug Garrett, Senior Director for Government Affairs, ICG Telecom Group, Inc. (ICG), met with Cmmr. Knight and Cmmr. Neepner in two separate meetings in San Francisco. Written materials (attached to the notice), including a copy of the order of the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas in Southwestern Bell Telephone Company v. Public Utilite Commission of Texas, et al. were used. At the meeting with Cmmr. Knight also present was Doroty Duda, advisor to Cmmr. Knight, and at the meeting with Cmmr. Neepner also present was Fassil Fenikile, advisor to Cmmr. Neepner. Nick Selby, counsel for ICG, participated in both meetings. Garrett and Selby, referring to the pending motion for a ruling regarding the jurisdictional nature of local telephone calls to Internet Service Providers (ISP), pointed out that 19 other states have ruled that local calls to ISPs are jurisdictionally intrastate and subject to reciprocal compensation. Garrett and Selby also noted the reasons that ISPs have turned to competitive local carriers (CLCs) for

local service, including the quality and value of service provided by CLCs. Garrett and Selby noted that the fact that incumbent local exchange carrier (ILEC) delays in paying reciprocal compensation to CLCs is damaging CLCs. Garrett and Selby described legal and policy reasons why CLCs are entitled to compensation for terminating local calls that have originated on the ILECs' networks to ISPs. ICG's representatives stressed that the Commission would be "dealing itself out of the Internet" and otherwise taking an unwise step to limit its jurisdiction if it accepted the mistaken arguments presented by Pacific Bell and GTE California Incorporated.
