GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003; 505 Van Ness Avenue; San Francisco, CA 94102; or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

Since the agenda package will be mailed to these locations, it will be available at these locations a day or two after the distribution date. These locations will not receive agenda items that are not ready on the distribution date.

If an agenda item is held over to a subsequent Commission meeting, that agenda item and any revisions to that agenda item that were available on the morning of the initial Commission meeting (as well as any further available revisions) will be mailed in the Escutia package for the subsequent Commission meeting; the item and its revisions will also be available for viewing and photocopying in the Commission's Central Files Office and field offices as set forth above.

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Summary: On July 21, 1998, John Hughes, manager of Regulatory and Policy Affairs Division of Southern California Edison (“Edison”), initiated oral ex parte communications with Michelle Cooke, advisor to Commissioner Henry Duque, at CPUC in San Francisco. Mr. Hughes reported the communications was a follow up to ex parte communications on July 17, 1998 (see Daily Calendar, July 24, 1998). “Phantom stock” is not actual stock as Mr. Hughes reported to Ms Cooke, but is merely a form of compensation to employees of two of Edison’s non-regulated affiliates. Mr. Hughes further stated such compensation thus has no relationship to cost of capital matters, and that public disclosure of the requested information could be detrimental to Edison International since it is commercially sensitive information. Concluding, the Edison representative cited Office of Ratepayers Advocacy’s (“ORA”) burden under Pub.Util.Code § 314, stating ORA must demonstrate “there is a transaction between Edison and its affiliates taking place and that there is an adverse impact upon Edison ratepayers.”

7/27/98 A95-06-002 Southern California Gas Company, for authority to adopt its proposed performance based regulation (PBR) formula which would reduce base rates by approximately \$42 million (2.7%) effective 1/1/97.

Summary: On July 22, 1998, Claudine Swartz, State Regulatory Relations Manager for Sempra Energy, acting on behalf of Southern California Gas Company (“SoCalGas”), met with Dorothy Duda, advisor to Commissioner Knight, and conducted oral ex parte communications. The meeting occurred at CPUC, San Francisco. Ms Swartz stated D97-07-054 fully addressed SoCalGas DAP funding levels, and that a follow-up resolution maintained such funding levels. She further stated the draft decision accepting the Officer of Ratepayer Advocates (“ORA”) petition to modify SoCalGas’ DPP funding levels did not address a \$6 million increase in rates, nor what the funding would be used for. SoCalGas continues to have low participation rates in the DAP program according to Ms Swartz. Finally, Ms Swartz explained the \$18 million 1996 funding level for SoCalGas included \$3 million for a one year pilot program which has since expired.

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Summary: LATE FILED. On July 21, 1998, Union Oil Company of California (“Unocal”) and Thermal Power Company representatives conducted oral ex parte communications in San Francisco with PUC officials in three (3) consecutive sessions as follows: (a) in person with Commission President Bilas, (b) in person with Commissioner Knight and advisor Dorothy Duda, and (c) by telephone with Commissioner Conlon and advisor James Hendry. In each session, the representatives explained that Pacific Gas & Electric’s (“PG&E”) proposed breakup fee is neither necessary nor reasonable. It was stated that the only CPUC precedent and relevant evidence, that pertaining to the El Segundo sale, supports the position that the breakup fee is unnecessary. Administrative Law Judge (“ALJ”) Careaga’s proposed decision should be approved, the parties stated,

because it balances all arguments regarding the breakup fee. The parties raised additional points with Commissioner Knight, including the matter of the right of first refusal, the unreasonableness of a \$2 million breakup fee, and challenging PG&E's assertion that due diligence on geothermal plants is more expensive than due diligence on other types of plants.
