GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

PacBell attendees were William Blase, (Vice President (Regulatory)), Mike Bennett (Director, Numbering, SBC), and Margaret Pascoe, (Director (Regulatory Numbering)). Summary: On August 4, 1998, Pacific Bell ("PacBell") representatives initiated and conducted consecutive 30 minute oral and written ex parte sessions with PUC officials. The first meeting was conducted with Commissioner Duque and his advisor, Timothy Sullivan. The second meeting was conducted with Mr. Jose Jimenez, advisor to Commissioner Conlon. A one page written handout was provided at each meeting. PacBell representatives were Bill Blase (Vice President, Regulatory), Ron Sawyer (Executive Director, Regulatory), and David Discher (attorney). At both meetings Mr. Discher explained that the historical cost methodology in the revised draft decision on right-of-way ("ROW") is inconsistent with Open Access and Network Architecture Development ("OANAD"). the Commission should gather more cost data, adopt the fairer Federal Communications Commission's proposed cost methodology, or do nothing on pricing. Summary: On August 4, 1998, Pacific Gas & Electric Company ("PG&E") engaged in oral and written ex parte communications with Michelle L. Cooke, advisor to Commissioner Duque. PG&E's representatives present during the meeting at CPUC were Jana R. Corey (Director, Regulatory Relations), Shelly S. Malekos (Manager, Rates), and Jeffrey N. Johnson (Manager, Customer Information Systems). Ms. Corey stated that PG&E's petition to modify D97-08-056 requests authorization for use of both functionalized (or bottom-up) and "top-down" billing methods through August, 1999. She further stated interval-metered customers are billed using the functionalized rate billing method using PG&E's advanced billing system ("ABS") For all customers, the total bill is exactly the same using either method according to Ms Corey's presentation. The energy portion of the bills are calculated the same way under either method, she added, accurately portraying the cost of or credit for PX energy. Of the 4700 accounts billed by ABS, PG&E stated 3200 are interval metered accounts, and of those, 1600 are direct access accounts and 1600 are full service accounts. Mr. Johnson stated the ABS may have a practical limit of 100,000 bills that can be processed per month.
