#### **GLOSSARY**

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Summary: On August 5, 1998, William Hein, Deputy Executive Director of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), met with Cmmr. Bilas in San Francisco. Also present were: Lester Wong, advisor to Cmmr. Bilas; and Melanie Grotty, Senior Project Manager, Emily Van Wagner, project manager, and Jose Guzman, Jr., attorney, for MTC. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Hein described MTC and its duties and functions. Grotty described MTC's TravInfo™ program and its ability to dial a single telephone number in every Bay Area code to receive Bay Area traffic and transit information. Guzman stated that the public interest required the continuation of the TravInfo™ program. Guzman pointed out that the Commission's adopted criteria for area code relief required at least a five year ability to meet telephone number demand. Guzman noted that assigning the 817 prefix to a carrier desiring to provide service to MTC would have no impact on any other local carrier's ability to obtain telephone numbers for the first years of any new area code's life. Guzman added that the carrier providing service to MTC could use all the other 9,998 numbers in the 817 NXX block to provide service to other customers.
