GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Summary: On August 25, 1998, attorney Nick Selby engaged in oral ex parte communications with Commissioner Knight and his advisors, Dorothy Duda and Robert Lane, and Jose Jimenez, advisor to Commissioner Conlon. Mr. Selby's ex parte notice indicated the communications occurred while he represented the California Rights-of-Way Coalition ("Coalition") at an all party meeting held at CPUC, San Francisco. The notice reports the Coalition consists of the ICG Telecom Group, Inc., AT&T Communications of California, Inc., MCI Telecommunications Corp., and AT&T Local Services. In addition to these organizations, the notice stated there were representatives from the following organizations in attendance: Pacific Bell, GTE California, Incorporated California Inc., CCTA, Pacific Gas & Electric, Southern California Edison, City and County of San Francisco, Cox, Teligent, Sprint PCS, and San Diego Gas and Electric Company. The notice cited five (5) points that were conveyed by Mr. Selby during the meeting, that: (a) in consonance with the administrative law judge's revised draft decision ("RDD") the Commission should be the agency of last resort in resolving disputes between telecommunications carriers and cities, (b) the Commission should reject as inaccurate the cities' argument that such a Commission role is not needed, (c) the pole attachment rate should be as adopted in the RDD, (d) existing interconnection agreements between incumbent local exchange carriers ("ILECs") and competitive local carriers should be modified as adopted in the RDD conclusion, and (e) the losing party should pay fees and costs in rights of way ("ROW") disputes as adopted in the RDD proposal.

Summary: On August 24 & 27, 1998, Pacific Bell ("PacBell") representatives engaged in oral ex parte communications with Mr. Tim Sullivan, advisor to Commissioner Duque. On 8/24/97 David Discher, General Attorney, Pacific Telesis, and Dan Jacobsen, Executive Director-Regulatory, PacBell, met with the advisor at CPUC headquarters. Mr. Discher

explained that Pacific Bell Information Systems ("PBIS") is willing to provide voice mail service to end user customers who subscribe to CLEC's who resell PacBell local exchange service. These customers would be able to contact PBIS directly, Mr. Discher said, or provide their order to the CLEC who would be able to pass it to PBIS. The PacBell representative further stated PBIS voice mail service will be available to these CLEC end user customers at prices, terms and conditions that are identical to those offered to PacBell end user customers. On 8/27/98 a follow up telephone call occurred wherein Mr. Discher explained to Mr. Sullivan the amount of time that would be needed to make voice mail available to reseller end users.

Summary: On August 26, 1998, in response to a telephone call by Tim Sullivan, advisor to Commissioner Duque, Ms Traci Bone on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco reiterated a position taken the previous day during an all party ex parte meeting conducted at the invitation of Commissioner Knight. (Ms Bone also indicated her stated position represented the collective views of the cities of Los Angeles, San Carlos, Palo Alto, Hayward as well as the San Mateo County Telecommunications Authority ("SAMCAT"), collectively the "Cities." Ms Bone told Mr. Sullivan it was the Cities' position that the Commission has no jurisdiction to resolve disputes between local governments and telecommunications carriers regarding access to rights of way. She indicated the telecommunications carriers' position at the previous day's meeting was that they were being "blackmailed" by local governments on fees, and that in determining that question the Commission would be required to refer to Proposition 13 case law. Ms Bone concluded by suggesting the Commission's attorneys consider whether the PUC has jurisdiction to interpret Proposition 13.

Summary: On August 25, 1998, in consecutive meetings at CPUC San Francisco, oral and written ex parte communications were conveyed by representatives of certain jurisdictions to Commissioner Duque, his advisor, Tim Sullivan, and to Lester Wong, advisor to Commissioner Bilas. The jurisdictions collectively referred to themselves as the "Cities" and were comprised of the cities of Los Angeles, San Carlos, San Francisco, Palo Alto, Hayward, and the San Mateo County Telecommunications Authority (or "SAMCAT"). Representatives from each jurisdiction were in attendance, and in addition the City of Hayward representative, Mr. Joe Hilson, was reported to also be the Chair of the League of California Cities Telecommunications Task Force. The ex parte notice reported the oral

communications were the same in each meeting. The Cities' expressed their concern over the Draft Decision in this pole attachment proceeding, and stated the position that the Commission has no authority to establish itself as an agency of last resort to resolve disputes between local governments and telecommunications carriers. The Cities also alleged the record relied upon to adopt the draft decision is comprised of unverified anecdotes, many of which they have verified to be false or misleading. The written communication, provided only to Mr. Sullivan and upon his request, was a copy of a document already filed in the proceeding by the League of California Cities, i.e. "Opening Comments...on the draft decision of ALJ Pulsifer on right-of-way issues" dated July 24, 1998.
