GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q** **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A** **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS** **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A** Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003; 505 Van Ness Avenue; San Francisco, CA 94102; or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

In addition, the Commission will make draft agenda items available for viewing and photocopying (at 20 cents per page) at the Commission's Central Files Office (Room 2002), 505 Van Ness Avenue, San Francisco, and in the Los Angeles, San Diego, and the following field offices: El Centro, Eureka, Sacramento and San Bernardino. Since the agenda package will be mailed to these locations, it will be available at these locations a day or two after the distribution date. These locations will not receive agenda items that are not ready on the distribution date.

If an agenda item is held over to a subsequent Commission meeting, that agenda item and any revisions to that agenda item that were available on the morning of the initial Commission meeting (as well as any further available revisions) will be mailed in the Escutia package for the subsequent Commission meeting; the item and its revisions will also be available for viewing and photocopying in the Commission's Central Files Office and field offices as set forth above.

Intervenors who have a financial hardship determination pending or granted shall be eligible to receive draft agenda item packets at no charge.

Summary: On August 28, 1998, attorney Earl Nicholas Selby on behalf of the California Rights-of-Way Coalition (“Coalition”) engaged in written ex parte communications with Commissioner Knight, and his advisor, Dorothy Duda (faxing the communications to Ms Duda, and providing a copy by mail to the Commissioner). The communications, attached to the Ex Parte notice, consist of a cover letter and attached point paper. (note: In Mr. Selby’s notice filed with the Commission, he indicated “for purposes of the Ex Parte communication, the Coalition...(consists)...of ICG Telecom Group...AT&T Communications of California, Inc., MCI Telecommunications Corporation, and AT&T Local Services.”) The written communications responded to earlier arguments by Pacific Bell and GTEC concerning reservations of space on poles and in conduits. Mr. Selby explains why competitive local carriers (“CLCs”) need up to nine (9) months—rather than three (3) months--to commence construction of attachments, and in that regard the revised draft decision should not be changed. As to whether CLC attachments are within the scope of utility easements, Mr. Selby cites Salvaty v Falcon Cable Television (1985) 165 Cal.App.3d 798 in response to the Southern California Edison (“SCE”) position. He states SCE improperly seeks to overturn that case through the Commission’s decision. Mr. Selby concluded by saying BOMA’s (Building Owners and Managers Association of California) opposition to “negative jurisdiction” lacks merit and is unconvincing.

Summary: On August 27, 1998, attorney Earl Nicholas Selby on behalf of the California Rights-of-Way Coalition (“Coalition”) at an all party meeting engaged in oral ex parte communications with Commissioner Knight, his advisor, Dorothy Duda; Jose Jimenez, advisor to Commissioner Conlon, and Fassil Fenikele, advisor to Commissioner Neeper. In Mr. Selby’s notice filed with the Commission, he indicated “for purposes of the Ex Parte communication, the Coalition...(consists)...of ICG Telecom Group...AT&T Communications of California, Inc., MCI Telecommunications Corporation, and AT&T

Local Services.” The notice indicated the names of other attendees who represented the following entities: Building Owners and Managers Association of California (“BOMA”), MCI, Teligent, First World Communications, Cox, AT&T Local Services, Pacific Bell, California Cable Television Association (“CCTA”), California League of Cities, City and County of San Francisco, and Morrison & Foerster. Mr. Selby urged the Commission to consider taking a “negative jurisdiction” approach” on issues pertaining to carrier access to private property, i.e. not asserting jurisdiction over building owners or managers unless their conduct failed to comply with core standards of non-discriminatory conduct. Noting that the revised draft decision did not adopt that approach, Mr. Selby recommended revision to advise building owners and manager they could be investigated for effectively acting as a telephone company for any failure to treat carriers in a non-discriminatory manner in allowing access to their buildings. Mr. Selby stated the Commission had used “negative jurisdiction” in other applications, and that the mere possibility of Commission investigation serves a normative and market-clearing function, thus enhancing proper negotiations between carriers and building owners.

Summary: On August 27, 1998, Pacific Gas & Electric (“PG&E”) mailed an ex parte letter to CPUC decision makers. Under the signature of attorney Louis Vincent, PG&E provided copies of the communication to Commissioner Conlon, his advisor Jose Jimenez, and advisors to Commissioner Knight, Dorothy Duda and Robert Lane. Mr. Vincent requested the Commission decision allow PG&E to provide telecommunications carriers with certain services related to the carriers’ use of PG&E’s right-of-ways. Services would be provided for a fee. PG&E opposes pole attachments above its electric lines, Mr. Vincent said, but if the Commission proceeds on that basis, conditions should be imposed limiting installation and maintenance to qualified electrical workers and ensuring Title 8 safety regulations are enforced. Mr. Vincent said “mistakes around high voltage facilities can be lethal.” Mr. Vincent added the utility must be provided radiation charts identifying safe operating distances if any radio frequency equipment is attached to the poles, and that a means to disconnect the antenna from the cell site must be provided. PG&E’s letter was attached to the Ex Parte notice.
