GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q Quasi-legislative proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Summary: On September 1, 1998, attorney Marc D. Joseph of the Coalition of California Utility Employees ("CCUE") conducted oral ex parte communications with Commissioner Duque and his advisor, Michelle Cook. The notice indicates the occasion was an all party meeting initiated by Enron Corp. Per the notice, organizations having representatives in attendance were: Southern California Water, San Diego Gas & Electric, DGS, Pacific Gas & Electric, CEC, Cellnet, NEV, University of California/California State University, Southern California Edison, Enron, CLECA/CMA, and the Energy Division of the Public Utilities Commission. Mr. Joseph stated that Enron wanted to change the purpose of the case, and that SPURR-REMAC's petition to modify the Commission's unbundling decision had been changed. SPURR-REMAC no longer sought to unbundle revenue cycle services separately from direct access according to Mr. Joseph. He further stated credits that exceeded the utilities' actual costs savings would shift costs either to ratepayers or shareholders. Fundamental unfairness would result if ratepayers were made to pay to encourage customers to leave the PX, Mr. Joseph continued, and it would give the utilities' the wrong incentive if they lost money every time a customer chose direct access service. Mr. Joseph's final point was that if PUC wanted to scuttle direct access, telling the utilities they would lose money every time a customer chose direct access is probably the way to do it.

Summary: On September 1, 1998, MediaOne Telecommunications of California, Inc.("MediaOne") sent an ex parte letter to Commissioner Knight and his advisors, Dorothy Duda and Robert Lane. Senior Corporate Counsel Theresa L. Cabral expressed MediaOne's criticism over the invasive and biased questionnaires being used in telecommunications questionnaires by some municipalities in the permit process. Ms Cabral stated that such invasiveness has nothing to do with legitimate public interest, and that new entrants into the market are disadvantaged by having to turn over such proprietary and competitively sensitive information. Ms Cabral said "unilateral, and sometimes arbitrary gatekeeping by cities should not be allowed to continue unchecked" and that the "Commission must assert jurisdiction over the cities or see its policy goals subordinated to the agendas, whether or not justifiable, of each city in California." Ms Cabral's letter was attached to the Ex Parte notice.
