GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003; 505 Van Ness Avenue; San Francisco, CA 94102; or by calling (415) 703-1798. Summary: On September 10, 1998 a representative of Southern California Edison ("SCE"), Bruce C. Foster, Vice President of Regulatory Policy & Affairs made oral ex parte comments before Commissioner Conlon and his advisor, James Hendry. The occasion was an all party meeting held at CPUC. SCE's Notice of Ex Parte Communications indicated that Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E) initiated the meeting. In addition to the aforesaid two (2) entities, other attendees included representatives from CCUE, SoCalWater (dba BE), San Diego Gas & Electric, DGS, California Energy Commission, CellNet, Enron, and the Energy Divison of PUC. Mr. Foster stated SCE agreed with the administrative law judge's proposed decision ("PD") in regard to revenue cycle service ("RCS") calculation based on the utility's net avoided cost of providing those services. He said that Enron and CellNet failed in their burden of proving their methodology satisfies Commission policy regarding RCS cost credits. SCE is concerned, he said, that several methodological aspects of the PD will result in cost credits not accurately reflecting SCE's net avoided costs. One difference between SCE and San Diego Gas & Electric ("SDG&E"), according to Mr. Foster, is that SDG&E assumes all labor costs are available. But some labor costs cannot be avoided, he said, citing the example of meter reading and the necessity to drive to the route and then walk the route. Mr. Foster then said the PD incorrectly rejects proposed geographic deaveraging. He said that SCE's proposal was intended to mitigate the risk of improper "cherry picking" and cost shifting, as energy service providers ("ESP") move to serve average, as opposed to poor paying, customers. Mr. Foster concluded by saying SCE identified savings that could be accomplished if up to 10% penetration occurred, an assumption he said that errs on the side of providing too large a credit for 1999.

Summary: LATE FILED. On September 8, 1998, Southern California Edison ("SCE") representatives Bruce C. Foster and Mike Hoover engaged in oral ex parte communications with Commissioner Neeper in a meeting at CPUC initiated by SCE. Mr. Foster praised the administrative law judge's proposed decision ("PD") with respect to revenue cycle service ("RCS") credits being calculated on the utility's net avoided cost of providing those services. He expressed concern, however, that several methodological aspects of the PD will result in cost credits not accurately reflecting SCE's net avoided costs. Mr. Foster further stated one of the significant differences between SCE and SDG&E with respect to the PD's methodology is that SDG&E assumes all labor costs are avoidable. Mr. Foster stated basing SCE's credits on SDG&E's methodology is contrary to the principle of accurately reflecting net avoided costs. Mr. Foster then pointed out the PD incorrectly

rejects proposed geographic deaveraging. SCE, like the other utilities, identified savings that could be accomplished if up to 10% penetration occurred according to Mr. Foster's commentary. He concluded by saying this assumption, if anything, errs on the side or providing too large a credit for 1999, during which the penetration level is very likely to remain in the 1 to 2% range.

Summary: On September 10, 1998, Zond Systems, Inc. ("Zond") and others engaged in oral ex parte communications with Commissioner Knight and his advisor, Robert Lane, during a meeting held at CPUC. Zond initiated the meeting, and filed the Notice of Ex Parte Communications on behalf of all attendees. Zond was represented by attorney Sara Steck Myers, with the other representatives and parties: (a) attorney Steven F. Greenwald on behalf of Oxbow Power Company and Bowerman Renewable Power Partners, L.P. and Olinda Renewable Power Partners, L.P. and (b) Frank De Rosa (Vice President, Western Region), on behalf of U.S. Generating Company. The notice indicated Ms Myers and Mr. De Rosa updated the commissioner on the status of A97-05-027. Mr. De Rosa stated the settlements in the proceeding are consistent with the directives of both the PUC and the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") to settle the Biennial Resource Plan Update ("BRPU") in 1995 and are consistent with AB 1890. Both Mr. De Rosa and Mr.

Greenwald indicated U.S. Generating and Oxbow are still honoring the option agreements and that the agreements are a backstop available to Southern California Edison ("Edison") and others in the event new, cost effective capacity did not materialize due to discontinuation of long term contracts. Ms Myers urged a decision be based on facts and law in effect at the time the parties were asked by PUC and FERC to settle, rather than litigate the BRPU. She stated Zond had wanted and intended to build a project in response to the BRPU auction and that, as a winning bidder, had a legally enforceable basis on which to proceed. Instead, she said, Zond had acted in response to PUC and FERC and, to resolve the matter, had settled with Edison. The three (3) representatives urged a Commission decision by the end of the year.

Summary: On September 10, 1998 Sempra Energy representative Claudine Swartz on behalf of Southern California Gas Company ("SoCalGas") spoke via telephone to David Gamson, advisor to Commissioner Neeper.
