GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

San Jose Water Company, for authority to increase rates by \$3,867,000 or 4.16% in 1995; \$4,348,000 or 4.43% in 1996; and \$1,713,000 or 1.67% in 1997 in Los Gatos, Saratoga, Monte Sereno, Campbell, portions of San Jose, Cupertino, and Santa Clara and in territory within the County of Santa Clara surrounding & adjacent to these municipalities.

Summary: On September 23, 1998, Fred R. Meyer of San Jose Water Co. ("SJWC") met with James Hendry, advisor to Commissioner Conlon at Mr. Meyer's request. He told Mr.

Hendry that SJWC's treatment of capitalized interest during construction ("IDC") prior to 1996 was reviewed and approved by PUC staff in two (2) advice letter filings and related correspondence. Mr. Meyer stated that the Water Division Ratepayer Representation Branch's proposed removal from rate base of capitalized IDC for the period 1987 through 1995 constitutes retroactive ratemaking and should therefore be rejected by the Commission. In addition to the aforesaid oral communications, Mr. Meyer provided Mr. Hendry copies of three (3) related writings, (a) an "issue" paper entitled "current Commission staff demands the removal of previously capitalized interest from rate base which capitalized interest was approved and included in rate base by prior staff and Commission decisions," (b) a copy of a 5/3/88 letter from the PUC Chief of the Accounting and Finance Branch of the Commission Advisory and Compliance Division to SJWC (Mr. Meyer), and (c) a copy of a 1/20/94 letter from Mr. Meyer ("SJWC") to PUC Project Manager Donald McCrea. The writings are attached to SJWC's Notice of Ex Parte Communications.

approving the settlement agreements between Southern California Edison Company and winning bidders in

Edison's biennial resource plan update auction.

Summary: On September 22, 1998 attorney Sara Steck Myers of Zond Systems, Inc. ("Zond") and others initiated and conducted oral ex parte communications with Commission President Bilas and his advisor, Julie Halligan, at CPUC. The others were Steven F. Greenwald, attorney for Oxbow and Bowerman/Olinda, Thomas R. Mason, CalEnergy Operating Co., and Albert K. Davies of Zond. Ms Myers and Mr. Greenwald stated a desire to expedite the process of A97-05-027 and eliminate or limit contested issues. Noting that two non-listed bidders originally protesting the application had reached settlements with the winning bidders and that now only the Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA") and The Utility Reform Network ("TURN") were in opposition, Mr. Greenwald stated the settlements are consistent with PUC and Federal Energy Regulatory Commission directives to settle the Biennial Resource Plan Update ("BRPU") in 1995 and similarly consistent with AB 1890. Mr. Mason and Mr. Davies stated both CalEnergy and Zond, among the winning bidders in Southern California Edison's ("SCE") BRPU, had made significant investments to participate in the BRPU and had been immediately prepared to build power plants in anticipation of a successful, winning bid. Mr. Davies further stated Zond had acted in response to the aforesaid directives and, to resolve the matter, had settled with SCE. Collectively, the representative urged the Commission to issue its decision before the end of the year, and stated reasons why they believed there should be no further
