#### **GLOSSARY**

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Commission Order Instituting Rulemaking, on the Commission's own motion, into the third triennial review of the regulatory framework adopted in Decision 89-10-031 for GTE California Incorporated and Pacific Bell.

**Summary:** On October 2, 1998, in consecutive sessions at CPUC, Pacific Bell ("PacBell") representatives Dennis Evans and Michael Sasser initiated and conducted oral and written ex parte communications with, respectively, Robert C. Lane, advisor to Commissioner Knight, and Timothy J. Sullivan, advisor to Commissioner Duque. The ex parte writing (below described) was provided only to Mr. Sullivan. The PacBell representatives stated that PacBell's "Z" factor proposal in R98-03-040 included the discontinuance of cost recovery for post-retirement benefits other than pensions ("PBOPs"). Mr. Evans said the resolution of the PBOP matter in the draft decision ("DD") rendered moot the PBOP issues that would have been considered in the Forum OII. The PacBell representatives also

explained that D92-12-015 authorized cost recovery for PBOPs when specified conditions were met. Mr. Evans stated PacBell's October 1995, 1996, and 1997 price cap filings were consistent with D92-12-015. He added that each of PacBell's price cap requests for PBOP recovery was approved, and that Resolution T-16102 concerning PacBell's October 1997 price cap filing anticipated that any changes concerning what costs should be authorized for PBOP recovery were to be prospective only. Since the DD determined that FASB changes no longer qualify for "Z" factor recovery, PacBell stated, the consideration of changes in PBOP cost recovery in the Forum OII is rendered moot. The writing provided to Mr. Lane and attached to the "Notice of Ex Parte Communication" was a six (6) column graph entitled "Regulatory Deferral of Intrastate SFAS 106 Costs" with the columns representing years 1993 through 1998 respectively.

**Summary:** On October 5, 1998, Mike Burke, Chairman of New Energy Ventures, LLC, ("NEV") met with PUC officials in four (4) consecutive sessions at the Commission's San Francisco headquarters. Oral ex parte communications were conveyed in the sessions in the following order: (a) to Michelle Cooke, advisor to Commissioner Duque, (b) to

Commissioner Conlon and his advisor, James Hendry, (c) to Commission President Bilas and his advisor, Julie Halligan, and (d) Commissioner Neeper and his advisor, David Gamson. NEV repeated arguments submitted in their 9/24/98 comments filed in the proceedings. Mr. Burke expressed support for the proposed decision ("PD") as to Pub.Util.C. § 369 and the applicability of competitive transition charge ("CTC") to new load. Mr. Burke said the distinctions in the PD were important so as not to eviscerate the exemptions in § 369. He said the adoption of the PD will avoid making the postderegulation environment more hostile for distributed generation than the pre-deregulation environment. Adoption of the PD, Mr. Burke said, would facilitate economic development by making the proposition of expanding or locating facilities in California as attractive, or more so, than in surrounding states.
