GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q Quasi-legislative proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Summary: AUGMENTATION REQUIRED

On October 6, 1998, the attorney for the Building Owners & Managers Association of California ("BOMA") sent a letter to all of the commissioners, their advisors, and certain PUC staff. The letter, signed by C. Gregg Ankenman, expressed opposition to the draft decision ("DD") provisions which would, according to BOMA, force private property owners to permit free, unfettered and uncompensated access to private property to scores of individual telecommunications operators. The letter further stated according to BOMA's Notice of Ex Parte Communication that the Commission's "methodology" in the DD was a "draconian and unconstitutional threat of summarily terminating telecommunications service to specific buildings or properties" and that BOMA was concerned over such an approach. BOMA said the Commission should recognize constitutionally protected private property rights, and that the forced access scheme in the DD is an exercise of authority which exceeds the Commission's jurisdiction.

Summary: On October 6, 1998, representatives from GTE California, Inc. ("GTE") met at CPUC headquarters with Commissioner Conlon and others for a meeting lasting 1½ hours. According to GTE's Notice of Ex Parte Communications, Commissioner Conlon initiated the meeting, with others in attendance including: the commissioner's advisor, Jose Jiminez, Dorothy Duda, advisor to Commissioner Knight, and representatives from Pacific Bell, Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA"), MCI, AT&T, and the California Manufacturers' Association. Elaine M. Lustig of GTE told Commissioner Conlon that Commissioner Knight's draft decision ("DD") required modification in two (2) areas. She said the decision unnecessarily exceeds the record in discussing future franchise impact claims, and that that issue should be left to a future franchise impact proceeding. She also said the DD should clarify which "Z" factors remain to be phased out for GTE. GTE representatives also stated no further PBOPs "Z" factor issues remain to be heard in the forum OII, and that the company recommends the inflation adjustment to category II price floors be suspended or eliminated along with application of GDPPI-X. The last point made by GTE was that cost floors should continue to be modified by advice letter, not by application.
