GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is

resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Summary: October 21, 1998, an attorney for Pac-West Telecomm, Inc. ("PacWest") initiated an ex parte telephone call to Timothy Sullivan, advisor to Commissioner Duque. The caller was John Clark of Gooden, MacBride, Squeri, Schlotz & Ritchie, LLP. Mr. Clark said PacWest supports the jurisdictional analysis contained in item H-6A of Commissioner Duque's draft to be considered at the Commission's 10/22/98 meeting. He said further delay in resolving the issue of whether local calls to Internet service providers are subject to reciprocal compensation would be undesirable. He said a number of parties have provisions in interconnection agreements that defer the issue to the generic Commission proceeding, and that case by case determinations would not be practical in those cases. Mr. Clark said Pacific Bell does not have a good reason for their objection to

paying reciprocal compensation because the level of compensation is small under the contracts with the exception of two contracts subject to ongoing complaint proceedings. **Filer: PaccWest**

Summary: October 22, 1998, Pacific Gas & Electric ("PG&E") representatives initiated a meeting with Commissioner Conlon at CPUC and thence engaged in oral ex parte communications. The representatives were Les Guliasi, Barney Speckman, and Edward Kurz. James Hendry, advisor to the commissioner, was also present. PG&E stated they have attempted to negotiate in good faith with AES in response to the latter's petition for modification of D94-06-050 and D95-03-019. Although PG&E had proposed to settle with AES, Mr. Speckman stated settlement talks ceased some time ago. He said the reason settlement talks ceased was due to the low probability of an agreeable outcome. Mr. Kurz said the Commission should determine that AES does not have an enforceable Final Standard Offer 4 contract, that the Commission should retain jurisdiction in the dispute, and that it should not be predetermined that AES is entitled to recover any of its alleged costs from PG&E.
