Summary: On November 17, 1998, the Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA") initiated three (3) consecutive ex parte sessions with PUC officials at Commission headquarters. The

ORA contingent consisted of James Scarff and Chris Danforth, but "The Utility Reform Network" ("TURN") also joined ORA in the sessions. Robert Finkelstein was the TURN attendee. Bromson asserted to Commission President Bilas and advisor Julie Halligan that AES does not possess a binding QF contract with Pacific Gas & Electric ("PG&E"), and that because AES chose to litigate rather than settle its dispute with PG&E, it should not now be able to come back to the Commission to obtain a settlement based on AES' bid preparation and reliance costs as called for in the assigned commissioners' ruling of 7/9/95. ORA concluded by stating any settlement considered by the Commission based on those reliance costs examined with a jaundiced eye AES' unsupported claim of millions in such reliance costs.
