The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda

You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

Bilas to consider that several request for proposals (RFPs) have been distributed for additional utility service to Mexico and will potentially attract a bypass pipeline. Swartz mentioned a proposal for an independent power plant in Mexicali and a local distribution company in Tijuana. She urged the Commission to consider these future opportunities. Swartz urged Cmmr. Bilas to consider Southern California Gas' proposal of only allocating exclusions up to the competitive contract rate.

Summary: On November 30, 1998, Claudine N. Swartz, State Regulatory Relations Manager for Sempra Energy, spoke with Dorothy Duda, adv. to Cmmr. Knight, via telephone. Paul Borkovich, Senior Market Advisor for Southern California Gas Company, was also present. In response to Duda's inquiry, Swartz explained that public purpose RD&D is the only public purpose costs that wholesale customers are allocated. She further explained that LEV costs are paid by all wholesale customers with the exception of SDG&E, as it operates its own LEV program. Swartz said that EOR customers are not directly allocated public purpose costs. Swartz stated that the majority of exclusion costs, approximately 90%, stem from ITCS and PITCO/POPCO transition costs. Further, Swartz encouraged Duda to consider that several request for proposals (RFPs) have been distributed for additional utility service to Mexico. She urged the Commission to consider these future opportunities and clarified that shareholders should not subsidize international projects.

Summary: On December 1, 1998, William H. Booth, counsel for California Large Energy Consumers Association (CLECA), contacted Ann Watson, adv. to Cmmr. Bilas, by telephone. Booth noted that CLECA, along with other parties, had moved to strike Office of Ratepayer Advocates' testimony which proposes that the basis for the allocation of transition costs among rate groups be changed from the current full Equal Percent of Marginal Cost (EPMC) approach to one using only Generation Marginal Costs on the

grounds that it was in violation of Cmmr. Bilas' Scoping Memo and AB 1890. He asked Watson to inquire whether a ruling consistent with the Scoping Memo would be forthcoming.

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
