NXX CODE LOTTERY WORKSHOP

The Telecommunications Division of the California Public Utilities Commission will be holding a second technical workshop on fine-tuning the NXX Code Lottery held each month at the CPUC. Decision 98-08-037 found there is a need for a fresh review of lottery procedures. This decision adopts the stipulation of facts presented by the parties in this proceeding and resolves the disputed issue of what sanctions should be imposed for admitted violations. We adopt the staff's recommendation that a \$20,000 fine be imposed, forebearing collection of \$10,000, the remainder payable over 36 equal monthly installments and upon the conditions that respondent, Felipa Garza Fuentes, performs no passenger carrier operations for three years, pays damages for an auto accident of her driver, (as ordered by the Small Claims Court) obeys all applicable laws and notifies the Commission if she leases vans or is employed by any other carrier.
