NXX CODE LOTTERY WORKSHOP

The Telecommunications Division of the California Public Utilities Commission will be holding a second technical workshop on fine-tuning the NXX Code Lottery held each

month at the CPUC. Decision 98-08-037 found there is a need for a fresh review of lottery procedures. said that the use of unbundled network elements, including combinations of UNEs, is the best service delivery method available to serve residential customers on a mass-market basis. He explained that Pacific Bell's proposed methods for offering UNE combinations would create technical problems and impair service quality, and are insufficient under the FCC's Bell South Louisiana II decision. MCI recommended that the Commission either resolve the UNE combination policy issue in its 271 decision or that it explains how the issue will be squarely addressed and resolved. Beach also explained that an efficient expedited dispute resolution process is needed to address problems that arise between competitors and affected customers. Beach described problems encountered in the commercial implementation of xDSL services. Harrelson stated that the FSR and ALJ's draft decision declined to addresss xDSL unbundling issues directly. He stated that, in any event, xDSL unbundling issues need to be resolved before in the Commission can seriously consider advising approval of a SBC/Pacific 271 application.
