In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003; 505 Van Ness Avenue; San Francisco, CA 94102; or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. You may also order a partial agenda package (energy agenda items only or telecommunication agenda items only) at the cost of \$500 per year. The package you receive via mail will include only those agenda items available at the time of the agenda distribution date, which is usually 10 to 12 days prior to the Commission meeting. If agenda items (including revisions) are not ready on the distribution date, they will be made available at no charge in the lobby outside the

Commission Auditorium at 9:00 a.m. on the morning of the Commission meeting, but not earlier.

Summary: THIS IS AN AUGMENTED NOTICE OF AN EX PARTE COMMUNICATION WHICH WAS FILED ON 12/30/97 AND APPEARED IN THE CALENDAR OF 1/5/98. On December 30, 1997, Robert Mazique, counsel for Pacific Bell (PacBell), met with Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Duque, in San Francisco. Also present was: Nancy Hensley, Regulatory Manager for PacBell. Materials (attached to notice), consisting of comments of The People of the State of California and the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California, were used. Representatives for PacBell stated that Internet communications and ISP traffic are interstate in nature. Representatives for PacBell stated that continuous communication begins with the customer, continues through the ISP server and ultimately reaches the web site's server—the exceptions are for e-mail and caching. Representatives for PacBell stated that the FCC and the courts have found ISP traffic to be interstate, and that if ISP traffic were not interstate, the FCC could not assert jurisdiction over the regulation of the ISP traffic. Representatives for PacBell stated that the FCC has asserted jurisdiction and has barred access charges on interstate Internet traffic. Representatives for PacBell stated that this Commission itself has referred to Internet traffic as interstate. Representatives for PacBell stated that under the interconnection agreement reciprocal compensation was for local traffic only, and that compensation for interstate traffic is handled through meet point billing. Representatives for PacBell stated that the agreement does not provide for reciprocal compensation for ISP traffic. Representatives for PacBell stated that allowing Pac-West to bill PacBell for the termination of ISP traffic and allowing Pac-West to bill the ISPs would let Pac-West double-recover its costs for ISP traffic.

Summary: On December 30, 1997, Phyllis Buckabee, Director of State Regulatory

Relations, Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) delivered a four-page letter to Cmmrs. Duque, and Neeper. Copies also sent to Cmmrs. Conlon, and Knight; Michelle Cooke, Dorothy Duda, David Gamson, Julie Halligan, James Hendry, and Bob Lane, Cmmr. Advs., and ALJ Ryerson. The letter states that SoCalGas opposes two modifications in a December 16 draft decision. It also states that SoCalGas opposes the modification in the draft decision that would limit the volume of gas service that could qualify for treatment as load from "new customers" under the joint recommendation. SoCalGas also opposes the modification in the draft decision requiring SoCalGas to provide to new customers being served under a negotiated contract or optional tariff schedule a warning in language other than that required by General Order 96-A about the possibility of the Commission later modifying the rates to be paid by the customers. SoCalGas is concerned that the draft decision implies that the Commission would modify the contract or optional tariff rates that new customers have relied on without strong grounds for doing so.
