Huckabee stated that the settlement contemplated the concerns which have been raised regarding the determination of incremental load that would be eligible for discounting. She also expressed concern with changes made to the settlement and now being contemplated by the Commission for adoption. Huckabee stated that limiting discounts to 5% of the core transportation program would render the program essentially meaningless. Van Lierop stated that the Commission did not contemplate a "pilot" program when it approved the concept of discounting for core customers in SoCalGas' PBR decision, and urged removal of reference in the draft decision to a "pilot".
