Scarff stated that he had communicated with Mr. Burhenn of Edison that ORA was requesting that information similar to that provided in Edison's sealed Reply also be provided to ORA at the time Edison files its compliance filing regarding the delayed sale of the Ormond Beach power plant. Scarff stated that Edison did not provide information about the number of bidders involved in any stage of the Long Beach auction. Scarff stated that ORA is willing to accept that this information is not

necessary for the evaluation of the auction process as it occurred with respect to Long Beach. Scarff stated that ORA may request this information with respect to future plant sales, including the Ormond Beach plant.

Summary: On March 3, 1998, Phyllis Huckabee, Director, State Regulatory Relations for Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas), contacted Cmmr. Bilas at the 1789 Restaurant in Washington DC. Also present were Frederick E. John, Senior Vice President of Public Policy and Law for Pacific Enterprises (PE) and William L. Reed, Vice President of Regulatory and Government Affairs for San Diego Gas and Electric Company (SDG&E). Reed stated that the five-year sharing proposal in ALJ Barnett's Proposed Decision (PD) does not fairly compensate shareholders. He stated that the 5.6 year period adopted in the SBC/PacTel merger and cited as precedent in the PE/Enova merger PD is not a valid comparison because the circumstances of the two merger are different. He stated that PE/Enova continue to support the full 10-year sharing schedule. John stated that the PD directs SoCalGas to divest its option to purchase the Kern River and Mojave California intrastate pipeline facilities is unnecessary, and if the Commission decides that it should be sold, it is necessary to have the agreements modified to allow SoCalGas to obtain fair value for the options.
