#### **GLOSSARY**

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS Ratesetting proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

## Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

Also present was Russell Worden, Regulatory Affairs Manager for Edison. The Edison representatives stated that the draft decision contains the correct interpretation of section 369. The Edison representatives pointed out that only if the incremental load is isolated from the utility transmission and distribution system, is Edison exempt from paying under section 369. The Edison representative stated that only one synchronous cogenerator connected to the Edison system has a "black start" capability. The Edison representatives further stated that because these generators rely upon the Edison system, customers would be obligated to pay Competitive Transition Cost, if the generators were to serve incremental load. The Edison representatives stated that the very parties seeking to expand section 369 exemptions are those primarily responsible for 70 percent of Edison's uneconomic cost, namely the above-market Qualifying Facilities contracts.

Mayer stated that on April 1, MID implemented a direct access program in MID territory. Mayer stated further that, MID's Competition Transition Cost is approximately 40 percent of a customer's bill. Mayer stated that there has been no increase in MID's rates in 3-4 years and there has been a 10 percent rate reduction for small customers. Manheim suggested that the Commission consider an OII to fully examine all aspects of distribution competition Mayer stated that the PD's reference to PG&E's rate design window options discounting is only available to customers over 20kW, which largely excluded residential and agricultural customers, most of who are being acquired by MID through this transaction.
