# GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasilegislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

# Subscription Notice for Draft Agenda Items

In compliance with Public Utilities Code Section 311.5, parties who wish to subscribe to receive draft agenda items may do so by writing to the Public Utilities Commission; Attention: Poly Arca, Room 1003; 505 Van Ness Avenue; San Francisco, CA 94102; or by calling (415) 703-1798. The cost for a one-year subscription to the entire public agenda package (which excludes Executive Session materials) is \$1,000. Summary: On April 29, 1998, Rick Witherington, Vice President of Government Affairs for AT&T Communications of California, Inc. (AT&T), met with Cmmr. Duque in San Francisco. Also present were: Tim Sullivan, advisor to Cmmr. Duque; and Robert Kargoll, AT&T Regulatory Advocate. Witherington urged the Commission to reject the SBC-Pacific Bell (PacBell) request for entrance into the long distance market until SBC-PacBell fully implements the 14-point competitive checklist. Witherington suggested not to eliminate the incentive of long distance relief before sustainable competition in the local exchange market is assured. Witherington noted that SBC-PacBell's own data demonstrates their monopoly position. Witherington attributed the paucity of local competition directly to wholesale prices and UNE rates that are not cost-based, and to SBC-PacBell's failure to implement the 14-point checklist. Witherington explained that the possibility of future local exchange carrier (LEC) involvement in the long distance market is a powerful incentive for SBC-PacBell cooperation in the local market competition. Witherington warned that once the LEC is allowed into the long distance market, SBC-PacBell's incentive to cooperate will disappear, local competition would stall, and long distance competition would be threatened.
