## GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q** **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A** **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS** **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A** Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

**Summary:** On May 26, 1998, Michael Salsbury, General Counsel for MCI Telecommunications Corporation (MCI) met with Cmmr. Conlon in San Francisco. Also present were: Jose Jimenez, advisor to Cmmr. Conlon; and James Lewis, Regional Executive - Western Public Policy Group, and Richard Severy, Director of Public Policy for MCI. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Salsbury stated that the companies expect all regulatory approvals to be in hand by July of 1998, and urged the Commission to conclude its approval process by then. Rebutting GTE's allegations that MCI and WorldCom could pursue anti-competitive strategies for Internet services, Salsbury explained that statistics for Internet usage are difficult to compile; that MCI WorldCom would carry less than 40% of the backbone traffic; that numerous other providers are building Internet capacity, making it difficult for any one firm to control the network; and that customers could easily switch to other providers. Salsbury emphasized that the merger will enhance local competition. Salsbury explained that the combined networks of the two companies can be utilized to serve a larger customer base than MCI could reach on its own. Salsbury also explained the current high prices in California render new entry uneconomic. Salsbury pointed out that, with the inadequacy of local resale discounts, it is essential that competitive local carriers be able to efficiently combine UNEs and to concentrate traffic in ways that overcome today's restrictions on collocation. Lewis referred to a recent article indicating that California consumers may be charged more for new services, than in the Ameritech region. Lewis suggested that this might be because UNEs and NRCs in other states are priced substantially lower retail rates in order to compete with competitive local carriers using low-cost UNEs. Salsbury stressed the importance of workable OSS to local competition. Salsbury explained that difficulties in opening the local market result in part from an inherent conflict of interest within the ILEC. Salsbury suggested that this can be remedied by divesting the local loop.
