GLOSSARY

After January 1, 1998, the California Public Utilities Commission is required by statute (SB 960) to categorize each case that comes before it. There are three categories, quasi-legislative, adjudicatory and ratesetting. If a case does not require hearings before it is resolved, the case is removed from the SB 960 category requirements. The legend below shows the abbreviation for each of the categories and provides a brief explanation.

- Q** **Quasi-legislative** proceedings are proceedings that establish policy or rules (including generic ratemaking policy or rules) affecting a class of regulated entities, including those proceedings in which the Commission investigates rates or practices for an entire regulated industry or class of entities within the industry.
- A** **Adjudicatory** proceedings are: (1) enforcement investigations into possible violations of any provision of statutory law or order or rule of the Commission; and (2) complaints against regulated entities, including those complaints that challenge the accuracy of a bill, but excluding those complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- RS** **Ratesetting** proceedings are proceedings in which the Commission sets or investigates rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities), or establishes a mechanism that in turn sets the rates for a specifically named utility (or utilities). Ratesetting proceedings include complaints that challenge the reasonableness of rates or charges, past, present, or future.
- N/A** Removed from the SB 960 category requirements.

Summary: On May 22, 1998, Rick Witherington, AT&T Communications of California, Inc. ("AT&T"), Governmental Affairs Vice President, met with Cmmr. Conlon in San Francisco. Also present were: Jose Jimenez, advisor to Cmmr. Conlon; David Condit, AT&T Pacific Region L&GA Vice President; and Rachelle Chong, a telecommunications consultant. Written materials (attached to the notice) were used. Chong stated that the 1996 Telecommunications Act requires the Commission to verify that all aspects of the 14 - point checklist have been met, before allowing a Bell Operating Company (BOC) entrance in the long distance market. Chong further stated that the key issue, involved in the SBC filing, is the limitation of local competition, not the expansion of long distance competition. Chong described the possibility of future local exchange carriers involvement in the long distance market as a powerful incentive for the SBC - Pacific Bell (PacBell) cooperation in the opening of the local market to competition. Chong stated that premature BOC entrance into

the long distance market, however , would dissolve that incentive, cripple or drive local competitors out of the market, and injure the customer. Chong further stated that SBC - PacBell's application fails to meet the 14 - point checklist in four categories. Chong recommended that the Commission reject the request of SBC - PacBell for entrance into the long distance market until full implementation of the 14 - point competitive checklist has occurred.
