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**NXX CODE LOTTERY WORKSHOP**

The Telecommunications Division of the California Public Utilities Commission will be holding a second technical workshop on fine-tuning the NXX Code Lottery held each month at the CPUC. Decision 98-08-037 found there is a need for a fresh review of lottery procedures. In this second workshop, the lottery process will be reviewed to determine if there are ways to make the distribution of NXX codes among carriers more equitable, and more conducive to the development of competition. Specifically, the topic of increasing the percentage of initial codes assigned from the lottery from the current 60% to a higher amount will be explored. **Summary:** On December 22, 1998, John P. Hughes of Southern California Edison Co. ("Edison") met at CPUC with James Hendry, advisor to Commissioner Conlon. The meeting was initiated by Mr. Hughes, but not arranged in advance. Mr. Hughes said Edison had filed a Petition to Modify D98-10-054 ("petition") because of an error in facts "20" and "21" of the decision. Mr. Hughes said the decision erroneously indicated Edison is authorized to seek recovery of its nuclear unit incentive procedure ("NUIP") rewards in the revenue allocation proceeding ("RAP"), when the NUIP rewards were already reviewed in the two ECAC applications. He added the Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA") had not contested the calculation of the rewards and that the decision found the NUIP reward calculations to be reasonable. Mr. Hughes referenced Mr. Hendry to Commissioner Conlon's ruling of May 14, 1998 in R94-04-031/I94-04-032 and handed him a copy of Edison's petition.
